



DUNFERMLINE GOLF CLUB DRESS CODE

GENERAL POLICY

Members and visitors are asked to ensure that they conform to a neat and clean standard of dress on the course and in the clubhouse.

GOLF COURSE & PRACTICE GROUND

- Shirt with traditional collar or polo neck, including tailored crew / turtle necks – no T-shirts, sleeveless shirts (men only), vests, football or rugby tops.
- Trousers - no denims, jogging bottoms, shell suits, jeans or combat styles.
- Shorts, if worn, must be smart - not safari or combat style. Beach or football / rugby shorts are not acceptable.
- Golf Shoes must be worn on the course – No trainers

CLUBHOUSE

- Appropriate golf attire as defined above may also be worn anywhere in the clubhouse, with the exception of golf shoes. Smart trainers may be worn.
- The wearing of head gear and waterproof clothing anywhere in the clubhouse is not permitted.
- Denim jeans are acceptable in the clubhouse but have to be neat, clean and tidy, of uniform colour with no cuts or tears.

COMPLIANCE

- Members, their guests, and visitors are expected to comply with the above dress code. Whilst a degree of latitude may be allowed, subject to the discretion of Officers and Employees of the Club who may be present at the time, any non-compliance with the relevant dress codes should be drawn to the attention of members and visitors to avoid repetition.
- Members and visitors may not be allowed on the Golf Course or in the Clubhouse where there is an extreme or obvious non-compliance with the relevant dress code.
