

## **EREWASH VALLEY GOLF CLUB**

We maintain a Dress Code in our clubhouse and on the golf course.

We understand, and are proud of the fact, that our members, visitors and guests come from a broad spectrum of society. Each individual will express him or herself differently, through their clothing, jewellery and personal appearance. We recognise and accommodate this personal freedom.

We also have a duty to our members, visitors and guests to create an environment, both on the golf course and within the club's premises, in which people feel comfortable.

With this in mind, please read the following and ensure that you abide by the dress code. Your co-operation helps the club to achieve its overall aim, which is to ensure that everyone feels able to relax and enjoy their experience at Erewash Valley.

## DRESS CODE IN THE CLUBHOUSE

- **1.** All members, guests and visitors must wear an acceptable form of smart or casual clothing, which can include smart denim jeans
- **2.** If a particular event requires a different dress code (e.g. a black-tie function), the club will make this clear in advance
- 3. Sunday carveries and private functions operate a relaxed dress code
- **4.** Please wear appropriate footwear. Golf shoes are allowed in the Spike Bar when it is open but not in the main bar
- 5. Do not wear t-shirts, rugby, football or cricket shirts or any shirt with prominent logos or writing
- 6. Golf shorts are permitted in the clubhouse during the summer course season
- 7. Wearing of baseball caps and wet weather gear is not permitted

## DRESS CODE ON THE COURSE

- 1. Golfers should wear recognised golf clothing, including golf shoes
- **2.** Do not wear denim or combat trousers / shorts, t-shirts, rugby, football or cricket shirts or any shirt with prominent logos or writing
- **3.** Please wear your shirt tucked in (ladies golf shirts designed to be worn differently are fine)
