## 9 Hole Competitions

There are 3 changes for a player when compared to the usual 18-hole competition which can often lead to confusion.

#### They are:

- 1. Calculation of Handicap Allowance
- 2. Buffer Zone allowances for any Handicap adjustments
- 3. Stroke Indices for the 9 hole cards

#### 1. CALCULATION OF HANDICAP ALLOWANCE

The Par of both cards is 35 and both the White and Yellow tees' 9-hole SSS is 70

Nine-Hole QUALIFYING Competitions MUST be in STABLEFORD format.

#### **CONGU 22.3**

A Nine-Hole Competition Handicap Allowance must be calculated as follows:

[Exact Handicap + Nine-Hole SSS - (Nine-Hole Par x2)] / 2

For example, if the player has an *Exact Handicap* of 12.8 and the Nine-Hole *SSS* and Par are 69 and 34 respectively the Nine-Hole *Competition Handicap Allowance* is:

$$[12.8 + 69 - (34 \times 2)] / 2 = [12.8 + 69 - 68] / 2 = 6.9$$
 rounded to 7.

Where the Nine-Hole *Competition Handicap Allowances* calculated for players differ from their *Playing Handicaps*, the Committee must make the players aware of their total stroke allowances for the competition.

Thus to calculate your 9-hole handicap simply divide your exact handicap by 2, rounding up as usual into a playing handicap

#### 2. BUFFER ZONE ALLOWANCES FOR ANY HANDICAP ADJUSTMENTS

The following Buffer Zones apply to Qualifying Scores over Nine-Holes:

<b>Handicap Category</b>	<b>Buffer Zone (Stableford Points)</b>
1	36
2 and 3	35 to 36
4	34 to 36
