

THE QUIZ!

SCENARIO:

Frank plays his tee shot on a par 4 hole and his ball comes to rest on a steep slope on a tuft of grass in the semi-rough. Frank decides to take a practice swing on the fairway several feet away from his ball, then walks towards his ball. Before he takes his stance or grounds his club, the ball moves forward half an inch.

Frank does not replace his ball and plays his next shot towards the green where it come to rest somewhere near the hole.

Mark, who is also playing in Frank's group then plays his approach which also comes to rest somewhere near the hole but neither player can see exactly where their balls came to rest because the contours of the green obscure their view.

On reaching the putting green, both players putt, hole out and walk to the next tee. Before making their tee shots, a player on an adjacent hole tells them that after Mark's ball pitched on the putting green it struck Frank's ball at rest and moved it nearer the hole.

WHAT IS THE RULING?

- Neither Frank nor Mark incur a penalty
- Frank incurs a one stroke penalty
- Frank incurs the general penalty
- Frank and Mark incur the general penalty
