The Course, Graham J Wells



for our greenkeepers handling large amounts of landfill which brings the total

received to nearly £25k during the first two months of the year. Some of this money will be used on vital projects on the course, notably the new training and practice facility but also for a new and much needed rough mower, bunker improvement and reconstruction and fairway over-seeding on which we have had to postpone work in the recent year's difficult economic circumstances. Some of the landfill is now being used to raise the height of the existing bank along the left side of the 3rd fairway. The conifers there will be removed and the area replanted with native local species as will the whole of the top of the bank around the greenkeepers compound.

Meanwhile, drainage at the bottom of the bank along the left side of the 5th fairway has been laid and the beginnings of a buggy path alongside it partially constructed. (This path will eventually lead right the way down to the raised 5th tee once all the landfill

has been delivered there later this vear). The old condemned hut and its foundations have been removed in preparation for the practice range. Several visitors have commented in complimentary fashion on the condition of the course, notably the greens (but not some of the bunkers!).

In March we will be preparing to cope with Rob Barrett beginning a well earned 3 week break so please be tolerant (and let us know!) of any shortcomings in course maintenance during his time away during which we will endeavour to resolve them with a request for volunteer working parties if they can help.
