On Monday 2nd April, there was a report on Granada News about a young boy, Jake Wynne from Cuddington, who had his wheelchair stolen from the front garden over the weekend. Jake, aged 12, who has cerebral palsy and is epileptic, can only walk a few steps and is lost without his chair.

Viv Nagle, one of the Powered Wheelchair Appeal Committee Members, saw the report and wondered whether we could help. She spoke to Bert Dyson and Penny Ainsworth who agreed that we should help.

Bert contacted Lucy Meacock, the Granada presenter who is also a great supporter of the Appeal, and she was delighted. Arrangements were made and, on the following day, Bert and Penny met with the Granada News reporter, Victoria Grimes and Eric Malkin of Five Towns Care Centre to present an interim replacement chair to Jake in Cuddington.

The look of joy on Jake's face was a picture. His Mum, Maureen, was thrilled and said that Jake could now enjoy his Easter holidays which would have been spoiled.

Eric, our supplier of wheelchairs, assessed Jake's requirements and we will be presenting Jake with his own new chair at the Spring Dance on Saturday 21st April 2012.

Jasmin Beadles, who will be 10 on the 13th June, is from St Helens and attends Lansbury Bridge school which she

likes. She supports Manchester United and loves to watch football. She also enjoys music and likes Olly Mers.

Conner Marsden, aged 15, is also from St Helens and likes anything with a remote control and especially his boat and helicopter. He supports Liverpool when watching football and St Helens when watching Rugby. He also likes watching all the cookery programmes and especially Jamie Oliver.



We played 5 rounds or 90 holes on a Better Ball Stableford basis with the Captain playing off full handicap. The following table shows our scores on each round along with the count of various categories on which people were asked to place a bet (see more below)

The best round above contained 10 birdies,7 pars and 1 bogey. We had "2's on both the 6th and 18th and had 8 gross 3's in a row from the 8th to the 15th. The first 4 achieved by the Captain and the second 4 by the Pro.

We were joined by 6 pairs of members, who each played 9 holes with us. Steve Johnson and Roddy Snedden joined us at 6:10 am, then John & Sharyn Butler at 11:00 am, followed by Frances Feldwick and Brian Kennerley. Phil Davies and Brian Stott played at 15:30 and then, from Sandiway GC, Anne O'Neil and her son Keith, long term supporters of the wheelchair appeal, joined us at about 5:00pm. Finally Neil Hughes and Alan Lee played the front 9 of the last round with us.

Kieran McCabe and Steve Cunniffe were due to join us for the final 9 holes but were unable to do so. This was just as well as the Captain and the Pro had to race round the final 9 in about an hour and a quarter to get the challenge completed before dark – they were very grateful that a number of the ladies came out in support and acted as ball spotters – this proved very necessary as it was almost impossible to see the ball at the end.

Nobody guessed our total Stableford score nor the number of "Pars" we would achieve so there is no pay out in these categories. Brian Prince won the "number of birdies" so gets a third of the funds placed in this category. Darren Jones was spot on with his guess of the 300 yard drive by the Pro (note it was exceeded but the ball was not on the fairway). The Captain (before we started!) and Karen Fozard both guessed 13 bunkers so will leave the money in the pot. All in all the total bet was £194 but only £23 will be paid out.

With money "bet" along with people "buying" 9 holes with us and a number of generous donations it is hoped that the day will have raised around £900 all of course going to the HGC Powered Wheelchair Appeal.



4.40am tee shot by the Captain






4.48am 1st Green - track marks in the dew

30 YEAR CELEBRATION DINNER WITH PETER ALLISS

On Tuesday 11th September 2012, members of Helsby Golf Club and supporters of the Powered Wheelchair Appeal were delighted to celebrate 30 years of fundraising for the Appeal with special guests Peter Alliss, Mark Eccleston and Jack Buchanan

At the beginning of the evening, powered wheelchairs were presented to 3 excited young girls. Alainah Hussain aged 12, who comes from Nelson in Lancashire, attended with her

Mum and Dad. She loves music and has a good singing voice. Her favourite, like many other girls, is Justin Bieber and she has pictures of him on the walls in her room. Next to receive their chairs were sisters Anisa and Zayneh Mohammed, aged 7 and 5 respectively, who come from Stoke-on-Trent. They are very close and do everything together including playing with their Bratz toys and shopping for everything 'girlie'. They came with Mum and Dad and brother Mustafa. All three girls were looking forward to the independence that their new chairs will give them, especially for the girlie shopping.

After an excellent meal, Mark Eccleston who won a silver medal in the tennis doubles at the 2004 Paralympics in Athens, delivered an inspirational speech. Mark spoke of how he overcame his disabilities, caused by a fall when he was only 16 which left him as a tetraplegic, to compete in a number of different sports at the highest level. Firstly, he took up table tennis and won gold at the National Wheelchair Games. This was followed by wheelchair rugby where he captained the Great Britain team at 2 World Championship finals and at the 1996 Atlanta Paralympics. He then needed a new challenge and was persuaded to take up wheelchair tennis at which he won 7 National titles and was the first British player to become No 1 in the world and subsequently won the silver at the Athens Paralympics. He is now passing on his enthusiasm for sport to the children in the Halton area where he is the Disability Sports Development Officer for special and mainstream schools. Two days a week, he teaches at Chesnut Lodge, the local special school in Widnes where he encourages the children to participate in wheelchair sports. He also runs after school clubs for the children for football and other sports. The Wheelchair Appeal has donated a number of chairs to children at the school over the last 30 years and Mark explained the life changing difference that a chair makes to them giving them independence and self confidence. He concluded by thanking all the supporters of the Appeal for their incredible generosity over the years.

Peter Alliss, 'the Voice of Golf', thanked Mark who he claimed is an inspiration to us all. Peter was staying in the area to commentate on the Ladies Open at Royal Liverpool, Hoylake and was putting in a lot of practise with the names of the large number of Far Eastern ladies who are now playing on the Tour as he did not wish to make any faux pas. He also congratulated Helsby Golf Club on the amazing work that they had done over the last 30 years to raise the funds to donate over 300 powered wheelchairs to local children with special needs. He explained that Helsby is the most successful member of his crusade to improve the quality of life of youngsters born with disabilities, the Peter Alliss Masters


