We held our AGM at the end of March and I'm pleased to say the members supported all the proposals which the Board had put forward. At the same time, we saw a number of members leave the Board and a new team was elected to take us forward. So, what can we look forward to in 2017?

Greens

Ivor Evans has agreed to take over the Chair of Greens from Jeff Gilham who retired at the end of his three-year tenure, and James O'Doherty who is new to the Board, will be joining Ivor on this committee. Ivor, of course, held this position prior to Jeff, so is returning to a familiar role.

It is intended to continue with the programme of course improvements in the autumn which will see the 14th tee rebuilt and the path up to the ladies tee replaced with the rubberised version. At the moment, I am hearing stories that a number of local courses are still struggling to get their courses up to standard as we emerge from the winter ... I am pleased that Matt and his team have done a wonderful job and Stowmarket is in great condition ... I hope this remains so. We hosted the Suffolk Amateur Foursomes Championship on the 23rd April and this was a great opportunity to showcase Stowmarket Golf Club.
