Golf rule changes 2019

The Rules of Golf have undergone a significant overhaul with many new regulations coming into effect from January 1, 2019. Several of the new rules have been implemented to improve the general pace of play at all levels of the game, and here is an overview of the standout changes...

- THE 20 MOST IMPORTANT CHANGES TO THE RULES OF GOLF 2019
- 1. SEARCH TIME REDUCED FROM 5 MINUTES TO 3 MINUTES
- 2. BALL MOVED DURING SEARCH REPLACE NO PENALTY
- 3. EMBEDDED BALL FREE RELIEF ANYWHERE THROUGH THE COURSE
- 4. MEASURING A DROP USE LONGEST CLUB (EXCEPT PUTTER)
- 5. DROPPING DROP FROM KNEE HEIGHT RATHER THAN SHOULDER
- 6. TAKING STANCE ON WRONG GREEN IS NOT PERMITTED
- 7. BALL UNINTENTIONALLY HITS PLAYER OR EQUIPMENT NO PENALTY
- 8. DOUBLE HIT NO PENALTY. NOW ONLY COUNTS AS THE 1 STROKE
- 9. TOUCHING SAND IN THE BUNKER INCIDENTALLY IS PERMITTED
- 10. LOOSE IMPEDIMENTS CAN BE REMOVED ANYWHERE INCLUDING HAZARDS
- 11. DROPPING A BALL OUT OF BUNKER 2 PENALTY STROKES
- 12. WATER HAZARDS NOW CALLED PENALTY AREAS
- 13. TOUCHING GROUND IN PENALTY AREA NO PENALTY
- 14. BALL MOVES ON GREEN AFTER BEING MARKED REPLACE WITHOUT PENALTY
- 15. BALL ACCIDENTALLY MOVED ON PUTTING GREEN REPLACE NO PENALTY
- 16. ALL DAMAGE TO GREEN CAN NOW BE REPAIRED
- 17. POSITIONING A CLUB FOR ALIGNMENT IS NOT PERMITTED
- 18. CADDIE ASSISTING WITH ALIGNMENT IS NOW NOT PERMITTED
- 19. PUTTING WITH FLAGSTICK IN THE HOLE IS NOW PERMITTED
- 20. BALL WEDGED AGAINST FLAG STICK AND SIDE OF HOLE IS DEEMED AS HOLED

1. Greens, Hollow tined and top dressed, treated ready for the new season. A reminder to everyone to repair pitch marks please

2. Tees, All tees have been top dressed and scarified. New yellow markers have now been placed. The new 4th tee is to come into use on the 27th April. 5th tee new irrigation system has been commissioned

3. Fairways, All fairways to be cut to 14mm and adjusted accordingly with the weather. Divoting parties commenced in April. Reminder to replace your divots please

4. Bunkers, A new daily deep raking policy of bunkers now in place. The new 7th fairway bunker is being designed and will be in place in the Autumn

"Trees and Root and Branch Inquiry"

In the recent magazine "YOUR COURSE" which is produced by BIGGA (British and International Golf Greenkeepers Association) there was a very interesting article on page 46, titled "A ROOT AND BRANCH INQUIRY". This article looked at trees on a golf course from the greenkeeping perspective rather than an arborists perspective.

have a responsibility to provide the best possible playing conditions for our members. The article will be used by the greens committee when considering if trees have an adverse impact on any part of our course, with particular attention being placed around the greens and tees.

Members will be informed of any future tree management work in advance of the work, with the reasons for this work, unless the work needs to be carried out as an emergency, i.e. storm damage.

NATALIE'S LEMON SPONGE RECIPE

Natalie's lemon sponge has been on the dessert menu in the clubhouse recently and has received great reviews. So, if you want to try it yourself at home, the recipe is below –

Preparation time – 15 minutes Cooking time – 1 hour Ready in – 1 hour and 15 minutes

Ingredients (serves 10)

- 140g (5 oz) self raising flour
- 110g (4 oz) caster sugar
- 110g (4 oz) butter or margarine softened
- 2 eggs beaten
- 2 heaped tablespoons of lemon curd
- for topping 2 tablespoons granulated sugar, zest of 1 lemon and 2 tablespoons of lemon juice

Method

1) Preheat the oven to 170c or Gas 3

2) Put flour, caster sugar, butter, eggs and lemon curd into a mixing bowl or processor and mix well together3) Put mixture into a greased or lined 2lb loaf tin or

traybake tin – whichever you prefer

4) Place in centre of the oven and bake for 1 hour − 1 hour 30 minutes

5) While the cake is baking, make the topping: blend together the granulated sugar, lemon juice and lemon rind

6) Once the cake is cooked, remove from oven and leave to cool in the tin for about 3 minutes. Then while the cake is still warm, pour over the topping so that it soaks into the cake. Leave to cool for about 30 minutes and then turn out of the tin

7) As an alternative to making the topping (step 5), spread some lemon curd onto the cake when slightly cooled (step 6)

Delicious served with cream, custard or ice cream – ENJOY!



Powered Wheelchair Appeal

The Appeal had another successful year in 2018 raising over £38,000 and presenting 12 wheelchairs to local children with special needs bringing the grand total over the last 35 years to 382.

In 2019, we are trying to raise sufficient funds to present our 400th powered wheelchair to a deserving child in November and set ourselves a target of \pounds 55,000 to get there. We have already raised \pounds 12,500 and presented our 384th wheelchair at the Race Night in March.

Helsby GC -Seniors



With the advent (that seems the wrong word for this time of year?!?!) of the new golfing season the seniors of Helsby GC will once again be coming out of hibernation, or for some, returning from warm weather training in time for the start of their own fixtures (see list below).

For the first time some of us can remember (not that many of us can recall that much really!) we won't be led in 2019 by Howard Jones who has this year decided to hang up his calendar and step down after a decade at the helm. We should of course thank him for his sterling efforts on our behalf over that time, sorting fixture dates, liaising with the club re tee times, looking after our funds and making sure we had match day organisers in place for each fixture. So on behalf of all the seniors who have benefitted from your efforts Howard, many, many thanks. For the time being, we haven't had anyone step into the Seniors Organiser role though Dave Mulholland has agreed to look after the money. Each fixture will be overseen by a different Match Day Organiser who will liaise with the club, kitchen, opposition and generally make sure everything works on the day.

For anyone new to the club or who has recently become eligible via reaching the age of 55 and who might have an interest in playing with the Seniors, a word on what it's all about! The only thing we ask is that you sign up to play both home and away games of the fixture and if for some reason you do have to pull out you take responsibility for finding a replacement (usually from the reserve list). So if you've not played before, we look forward to seeing you (you will enjoy it, promise) or if you're a


