Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The charity raised and contributed towards the purchase 2 powered wheelchairs in its own right valued at £6,311 and assisted other part purchases valued amounting to £1,745. In addition, golf clubs and other organisations, placed a further £99,515 with the charity to be spent specifically on the purchase of a further 27 chairs which were provided to children on their own nomination.

Other organisations dealing directly with suppliers, but buying chairs through the charity's "Golf Chair Scheme" donated a further 16 wheelchairs costing £50,936 meaning that the total no of chairs donated by the cause sponsored by this charity was 44 valued at £150,451

All of these chairs were purchased through the charity's "Golf Chair Scheme" set up with a number of dealers in powered wheelchairs and mobility aids. The arrangement enabled a financial contribution to be made to the set up and running of a prestigious annual golf tournament. Members of clubs, who raised sufficient funds to buy a chair (or chairs) through the scheme, were invited to play in this event in recognition of their fund raising efforts.

The charity runs an annual golf tournament to which members and supporters are invited, in recognition of the efforts to raise funds for the purchase of wheelchairs. Although the cost of the tournament is borne by the charity's main sponsors the charity retains sufficient funding to underwrite the cost of the event if necessary.
