Bookings for this event can be made at the bar, and it is hoped that members will support this event.


#### **Greens News**

A big thank you to all those who have:

- Repaired Pitchmarks, it only takes seconds but the damaged from an unrepaired one lasts for weeks.
- Replaced or filled divots, again seconds to do with long lasting gains.
- Raked their bunker, we all know how depressing it is to find the ball in a bunker and then even worse to see it in a footprint.

Please all members be reminded not to take trolleys over the greens, surrounds and onto tees. Do not practice on the course by hitting lots of balls from the fairways and stay calm if you miss a

putt. These actions cause more harm to the course so please respect it.





Winter is on its way, the new bunkers are coming on well and the course is recovering from the very hot and dry summer. Help it stay in good condition by not attending the flagstick unnecessarily, if you only go on to a tee to play your shot think how much less wear there will be from footprints. Buggy drivers please don't drive all over looking for someone's ball, keep off fairways when frosty and don't drive right up to a white line, allow yourself some turning space so you don't have to scuff the ground to turn.

When the newly bunkered holes are in play please keep off the new turf, use a scoop to retrieve your ball from the turf and enter the bunker from a board. You can walk in the bunker rather that scoop at the ball that will try and evade you.

Those early morning starters from the 10th please remember that the greens staff have to try and get their work done so be prepared to wait or better still tee off from the 1st so that you are behind us.



The reconstruction of the bunkers on holes 2, 6 & 7 has gone really well. All of the construction and liner is already in place and turfing is well underway.



### Take care on the Course

We would like to take the opportunity to remind all members that the course, its steps and surfaces may be slippery when damp and wet. Golfers must ensure that they wear appropriate footwear to meet the prevailing conditions. Wherever possible, keep to Footpaths & Steps.

#### Launch of the new Rules of Golf

Many members will now have obtained a copy of the new Player's Edition of the Rules of Golf, due to come into effect in January 2019. This is an abridged version of the Rules of Golf and is written with a focus on the golfer, covering the rules most relevant to you as a player. This Rules Book is very much slimmed down compared to what we have been used to and uses diagrams and charts to help visually explain the Rules. This is a great opportunity for us all to refresh our knowledge of the rules. In addition to publishing this new book, the governing bodies are providing further information through their websites and I would encourage you to look at the R&A and England Golf websites if you require further information.

You can also choose to "Become a Rules Guru" by signing up on the England Golf website. You will then receive a weekly email written by their in-house Rules experts, which includes explanations, reasoning, videos and a quiz to test your new-found knowledge. Having a good knowledge of the rules of golf can benefit us all.
