This year's event was the 26th staging of the event and the last, at least in the foreseeable future, to be played on the wonderful links of the Golf House Club Elie.

The event started as usual on the Monday evening with a reception followed dinner at the Craw's Nest Hotel, Anstruther. Our patron Peter Alliss and his wife Jackie were both with us this year and Peter explained why the charity had decided to move away from Elie as a venue but more about this later. Tuesday morning saw Peter on the 1st tee and announced everyone before they teed off. First up was Ally Berry, the current British Disabled Open champion, who despite having no hands plays off a handicap of 1, the lowest in the field. 54 golfers played this year, including 14 ladies and, although teeing off on a fine day, everyone was confronted with a strong and challenging wind off the sea which to some extent restricted scoring. The winner and hence the "Peter Alliss Master 2013" was Jason Waite of the Tytherington Golf Club who, with a fine 38 points playing off a handicap of 12, pipped his club mate Sean Finlay (7) by just one point. The Ladies prize was won by Jenny Dunn, the Ladies Captain of Malkins Bank GC playing in her first Peter Alliss Masters. The full results are listed below.

After the golf the highlight of the day was the presentation by Peter of two powered wheelchairs in the clubhouse. These went to two very deserving children; the first to 12 year old Jazmin Osey a Scottish lass from Lochgelly in Fife, who was accompanied by her Mum and Dad. The second chair went to 14 year old Christian Darlington a Muscular Dystrophy sufferer who came all the way up from England with his family to take part in the ceremony.

Tuesday evening saw the usual Presentation dinner back at the Craw's Nest when the worthy winners received their prizes with Jason receiving his Green Jacket along with the traditional Quaich (Scottish drinking Cup) that he will keep for a year.

After dinner Adger Brown, long-time supporter of the charity and now the lead fundraiser at his club, Cooden Beach in Sussex, entertained everyone with hilarious repartee and then auctioned a number of items to raise funds for the charity.

Overall during the course of the two days, with a "heads and tails" sweep on Monday night and a golfing challenge on the 3rd tee during the tournament and Adger's efforts, over £2,500 was raised and was sufficient to cover the cost of young Jazmin's chair. Well done to everyone.

Why was this the last time the event was being staged in Scotland? It is a sad fact that, for reasons unknown, Scottish clubs, apart from of course the Golf House Club and the Ladies of the Elie & Earlsferry Ladies GC, have not been strong supporters of the "Wheelchair crusade". Nevertheless many chairs have been presented over the years to Scottish children and it was felt that since the "Masters" is primarily supported by English clubs this needed to change. The event will therefore move to the "Old Thorns Golf & Country Club" near Liphook in Hampshire next year. Modern, comfortable accommodation is available on site and close to the course designed by Peter Alliss and Dave Thomas. It is anticipated that this move will offer exciting prospects for the further development of the charity. It would however be quite wrong not to acknowledge the wonderful support that both the Golf House Club and the Craw's Nest have shown the charity over the last 26 years
