

Supplementary Scores 2017/18

The Match & Handicap Committee wish to clarify to all members the procedures for submitting supplementary scores effective from January 1st 2018

- Supplementary scores are no longer allowed for category 1 players. Players in handicap categories 2 and above can submit either 18 hole or 9 hole supplementary scores up to a maximum of 10 per year. The condition which limited supplementary scores to 1 per week is removed from January 2018, except for Category 1 players (CONGU 21.4 & 21.5).
- It is **not allowable** for a player to submit a supplementary score which has been completed within a 'non-qualifying' competition, pairs, team or singles, even if he/she has signed-in. (CONGU 21/1).
- 'Away' supplementary scores are only allowed from a club at which a player is an 'away member.

- In order for the cards to be accepted, members **must** follow the correct procedure according to Congu and as laid down by Erewash Valley Golf Club in this procedure document:
 1. A player **must** sign their intention to submit a supplementary score **before** play commences by signing in for a 'Supplementary Score' at the PSI screen in the corridor by the side door of the Pro Shop.
 2. Please indicate on the score card which tees have been used by ticking the appropriate box, and make sure the card is dated.
 3. Summer white, yellow & red tees along with winter yellow & red tees are acceptable for handicap purposes. Please note that the course comprising our green 'members' tees has no measured SSS and is not acceptable for handicap scores. White tees should only be used if play is within a club singles qualifying competition. During social play, the yellow tees should be used.
 4. A card for handicap cannot be accepted when the winter local rule of 'placing through the green' (ie fairways & the rough), is in operation; please check before submitting a card. Placing 'on closely mown areas' ie fairways, first cut green surrounds & mown pathways is acceptable.
 5. The card may be completed using gross scores or, from late 2016, stableford points are allowable. If using stableford scoring, please record the gross scores where you have them.
 6. The card must be signed by another club member male or female who holds a current handicap.
 7. In the case of cards for juniors, the marker must be a current playing club member over the age of 18 with a handicap, male or female
 8. On completion of the round, scores should be entered in to the computer via the PSI screen, with the appropriate 'course card' selected.
 9. Following score entry, the card should be posted through the letter box in the match office door.
 10. Cards submitted without prior sign in, or when sign in occurred after play, will not be accepted. Be aware that date and time of sign in and score entry are recorded by the computer.
