



HUNTSWOOD GOLF CLUB COMPETITION CONDITIONS - INFORMATION

MEN – monthly weekend and mid-week medal and stableford

Weekend Competitions **Division 1** - Handicaps up to 16

Division 2 – Handicaps 17 to 54

There is also a 2s competition run for men's monthly weekend competitions

Mid-week competition – one division for all players

The Men's Midweek Medal and Stableford competitions have no draw and can be played at any time during the day –you must follow all other guidelines.

TEES – men's monthly competitions are played from the white tees

LADIES – monthly medal and stableford (run as one competition held over 2 days (weekend and Tuesday) (players may enter on one day only)

Division 1 – Handicaps to 24

Division 2 – Handicaps 25 to 54

TEES – ladies monthly competitions are played from the red tees

MIXED - General/ Charity Days – Usually one division for all handicaps

TEES – usually men play from yellow tees, ladies play from red tees – or as stated on sign in

JUNIORS – Regular organised competitions

SENIORS - Regular organised competitions

All players must tee off within the times stated for the competition unless agreed with officer of the day / competition organiser.

No "gimmes" are allowed in monthly competitions as there are prizes associated, you must Putt-out and complete the hole.

Ties will be resolved by countback using holes 10-18 of the course – last 9 holes, last 6 holes, last 3 holes, last hole

Monthly Medal & Stableford competition cards can only be signed by members from the same playing section of the club.

Competition Handicaps – all members can enter monthly competitions but only players with competition handicaps will be eligible to win prizes

PRIZES - will be awarded as follows

Men's weekend monthly competitions and Ladies monthly competitions – prizes awarded to 1st and 2nd place per division

Men's mid-week competitions –

up to 5 entries = 1st only, 6+ entries = 1st and 2nd place

In the event of a tie, the winner will be determined by countback using the nett score

Competition entry sheets will be displayed in advance on noticeboards – if you would like to play please enter your name

When the draw has been made, tee time details will be displayed on the noticeboard, website and available from the pro-shop



ARRIVAL - Please arrive in advance of notified tee time (at least 30 minutes) to allow for any changes on the day and to complete the following – signing in / practice and to be on the tee 10 minutes prior to notified tee time to meet your playing partners and exchange cards.

SIGN IN TO COMPETITION

Qualifying competitions (such as medal, stableford, charity day) – declare your intention to enter the competition by signing into Club V1 PSI terminal – **this must be done BEFORE you go out to play** - at this time you will check and confirm your handicap (current handicap list also available in the changing room). **If you do not sign in before you play your card will not count in the competition.** If you are not sure about any details of the competition please ask

PSI TERMINAL SIGN IN –

- Tap the screen and enter the first digits of your surname (alternatively you can swipe your member's green card through unit on side of terminal).
- When your name is displayed tap on it to display options including box "Sign In".
- Tap on "Sign In" box – all valid competitions will be displayed
- Tap on the competition you wish to sign into.
- Tap "Yes" and then if nothing else required tap "No"

If you are not sure how to use the terminal please ask someone to show you. If the terminal is not working please ask for help.

If the terminal is not working sign in using a competitions sign-in sheet from the pro-shop

Non-Qualifying Competition - Print Name and sign the entry sheet noting your entry number, tick any appropriate boxes
"Two's" – sign entry sheet if you wish to be entered

PAYMENT ENVELOPE – Medals, Stablefords, Club Championships and Knockout Competitions – before you play, place the correct entry fee in an envelope. State Name of Competition (e.g. March Medal), the date, the amount being paid for each area (e.g. medal fee, twos fee etc.) and total being paid. Put monies inside, seal and deposit in competition box.

SCORECARD – Fill in the following areas – if not already done for you – and check if it has and fill in as appropriate:

Competition Name, Date of Competition, Entry Number (if applicable), Your Name (Player A), correct Handicap (check on PSI terminal or current handicap list displayed in the changing room), and indicate the tee you will be playing from for the competition

On the Tee – In the 10 minutes prior to your tee time - Exchange cards with a playing partner – check all boxes are filled in.

MARKING THE CARD – this is very important!

After each hole is completed move away from the green (towards the next tee), check and agree gross scores - yours and the player whose card you are marking.

For Medal and Stableford competitions **enter in column A ONLY THE GROSS SCORE of the player who's card you are marking, do not put anything else in the box**

Stableford Competitions - you can enter (if you want to as a record) the points scored in the points box. In the Markers Score box you should record your gross score and may record points for each hole if you want to.

At the end of each 9 hole section total up the Gross Score (Column A) and enter the total – you can also total/ enter Stableford points /Nett scores if you are recording these.

At the end of your round prior to entering the clubhouse check and agree all scores with your playing partners for both your card and the card you have been marking and ensure both are correct.



To assist the scorer's check for a Stableford competition you can put the total points scored (if recorded) in the Box at the bottom left of the card, for a Medal you can record the Nett Score (gross score minus shots received in the Box at the bottom left of the card).

When all scores have been agreed and you are happy the scores recorded are correct –

- **On the card you are marking Sign and Print your name in the Markers Signature area**
- **On your card sign your name in the Player's Signature area.**
- *** The Score you are signing for is the Gross Score not the points or any calculations ***

Once checked, signed with the two required signatures you must enter your score in the Club V1 PSI terminal in the clubhouse

PSI TERMINAL SCORE ENTRY –

- **Tap screen and enter first digits of your surname (or swipe member's green card).**
- **When your name is displayed tap on it to display options including box "Score Entry".**
- **Tap on "Score Entry" box.**
- **Enter GROSS SCORES only per hole – you can swap the score entry to left handed if required so the input numbers move to the left side of the screen**
- **Carefully double check the scores as you enter - you will be asked to check and accept each 9 holes separately**
- **Once you click on "Accept" box you will not be able to amend so please check carefully**

If you make an error – please advise the Handicap Secretary to be aware when processing the competition

If the terminal is not working please ask for help. If still not working place completed card in box with an explanation note on for Handicap Secretary to input scores

Once terminal entry completed place your card in the Competitions Box in the Clubhouse
If you do not put your card in the box your score may be processed as a "No Return"

For non-qualifying competitions you may not be using the PSI Terminal, in which case, please hand in card as advised on the day of the competition.

You are responsible for your Handicap – if you have a really good round your handicap may be cut. If you are playing your next round before the scores are processed it is **YOUR RESPONSIBILITY** to reduce your handicap manually in line with CONGU regulations. Details displayed on noticeboard. If you are not sure please ask.

CLUB KNOCKOUT COMPETITIONS

Entrants must have played 4 qualifying competitions in the 6 months prior to competition commencement.

Summer Knockout Qualifying Period - 1 October to 31 March inclusive

Winter Knockout Qualifying Period - 1 April to 30 September inclusive

SINGLES – Men and Ladies, PAIRS – Men, Ladies and Mixed

SINGLES – Matchplay full handicap difference (higher handicap – lower handicap = shots given)

Knockout Competitions held : SUMMER (April –September), WINTER (October-March)

SUMMER PAIRS – Matchplay betterball 90% handicap difference applied (handicap minus lowest handicap then 90% = shots given) Lowest handicap plays off scratch

WINTER PAIRS – Greensomes (0.4 x higher handicap + 0.6 x lower handicap) (higher handicap minus lower handicap = shots given)



In the event of a tied match after 18 holes, the match must be played to conclusion starting at the 1st hole allocating shots as appropriate
Men – played from white tees
LADIES – played from red tees

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS (GROSS)/ BISHOP TROPHY (NETT)

2 days full handicap medal play held on Saturday and Sunday of August Bank Holiday weekend
Entrants must have played 8 qualifying competitions in the year prior to the commencement of the competition from the day after previous year's Championship
In the event of a tie, the winner will be determined by a play-off. The play-off holes will be determined and detailed prior to entry

ALL WINNERS

Winners of handicap qualifier competitions through the year are invited to compete in the All Winners 18 hole medal competition held in July
Ties will be resolved

ARTHUR STALLWOOD MEDAL

A competition held in memory of Arthur Stallwood. Held beginning of October around the time of Arthur's birthday. A regular medal competition but with men and ladies on the course at alternate tee times competing for the men's or ladies cup.
For the ladies the monthly medal competition is held over the Saturday and the Tuesday with only the Saturday players competing for the cup

RBL POPPY MEDAL

A medal competition held in November. A regular medal competition but with men and ladies on the course alternate tee times competing for the men's or ladies poppy medal.
For the ladies the monthly medal competition is held over the Saturday and the Tuesday with only the Saturday players competing for the poppy medal

CHARITY DAYS/ FUN DAYS

Specific competition details will be displayed on the noticeboard for sign-up

EXTERNAL COMPETITIONS

Huntswood enter many external competitions through the year. If you would like to be considered to be part of the team please speak to your captain

ORDER OF MERIT

Men and Ladies competitions run separately through the year Jan-Dec.

In qualifying competitions points are awarded to each player in order of results

MEN 25 points for 1st, 24 for 2nd etc per qualifying competition (No OOM points awarded for mid-week competitions)
LADIES Points awarded per day of monthly aggregate competition 12 points for 1st, 11 for 2nd. 24-1 points awarded in order of result for single division competitions

ECLECTIC

Men and Ladies competitions run separately through the year Jan-Dec.

Lowest gross score per hole is recorded for medal rounds only – cumulative result as year progresses

Winner = lowest total gross for 18 holes

Men's mid-week medal does not count towards the men's eclectic competition

Please note – this list is not exhaustive and additional competitions may be run as required
