# 1<sup>st</sup> Hole



### **Tee and Fairway**

<u>Green</u>



### <u>Pro's Tip</u>

A testing hole with heather mounds to the left. It is always a tough fairway to hit. A drive over the road is rewarded by a better angle to the green. Aim your tee shot right of the fairway centre. For your second, aim left of the flag to allow for the gentle left to right slope and take a little extra club as the approach is slightly uphill.





## Tee and Fairway

### <u>Pro's Tip</u>

A tricky par four where position with your tee shot is important. Aim right of centre to open up the green for your second shot. For your second shot, aim right of the green to avoid rolling off the green to the left.





## Tee and Fairway

<u>Green</u>



### <u>Pro's Tip</u>

Aim your tee shot straight at the marker post to allow for the right to left slope. For your second shot, aim to carry the ball onto the green to avoid an uneven bounce short. Don't be fooled by the green appearing closer than it really is.

# <u>4<sup>th</sup> Hole</u>

### <u>Pro's Tip</u>

An extremely tough par three - the green slopes away on all sides, so a shot into the middle of the green is ideal. There is more room back right of the green than it looks from the tee. Better to take too much rather than too little club on this hole. All the trouble is short of the green.

### <u>Pro's Tip</u>

A tough par four – aim your tee shot left of the fairway centre to open up the green for your second shot. Long hitters can go slightly right to avoid running out of fairway. Your approach shot needs to be exact in length and direction as the bunkers at the front of the green are worth avoiding!

### <u>Pro's Tip</u>

A lovely par three that requires a mid-iron for most players. Be sure to use enough club to miss the bunkers at the front and check the wind direction before playing.
