

PADESWOOD AND BUCKLEY GOLF CLUB

Club Rules

1. All previous rules are hereby cancelled

2. RESPONSIBILITY

a) The Club Council is responsible for making, amending or withdrawing rules for the use of the course and clubhouse which together with the Rules of Golf as published by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St. Andrews shall be the Rules of the Club. A copy of the rules shall be kept behind the bar.

b) The Rules will be maintained on a computer and will be updated with any changes. All members will be able to access this information through the Club website. If any member requires a printed copy of the Rules one will be provided on request. It will only be up to date at the time of printing and may subsequently change.

c) Latest versions of Codes of Practice and Conduct and Policies for the Club (such as the dress code, Health & Safety Policy and Buggy Policy) can also be found on the Website and printed copies provided on request. The codes and policies are rules of the Club and must be treated as such. They will only be up to date at the time of printing and may subsequently change.

3. DUTY OF MEMBERS

a) A Member joining the club is considered to have submitted himself/herself to the Rules and Regulations of the Club, both as to the restrictions and the penalties imposed and on these conditions alone are entitled to enjoy the advantages and privileges of the Club

b) All Members are expected to conduct themselves in an orderly and sporting manner in the best interests of the Club and to support the Council and put any issues in writing to the Club Secretary for consideration by the Council.

c) Persons using the course are responsible for any damage or injury caused by them to persons or property within or outside the environs of the Golf Course.

d) The conduct of any member of staff shall in no circumstances be made the subject of a personal reprimand by a Member. Complaints must be made in writing to the Secretary.

e) If any Member shall violate the Rules and Regulations of the Club, or be guilty of any conduct which, in the opinion of the Council, is injurious to its character and interests, it will be dealt with according to the Disciplinary Code of Conduct for Members a copy of which is available from the office

4. VISITORS

a) A visitor to the Club, paying the appropriate 'green' fee is deemed to be a member for the day and is entitled to use all the facilities of the Course and Clubhouse. They may be supplied with and/sold alcohol for consumption on the Club premises. He/she is also required to observe all the Rules of the Club

b) Visitors to the Club who are taking meals in the clubhouse or restaurant or attending any function organised by the Club may be supplied and/or sold alcohol for consumption on the Club premises.

c) Members may introduce other visitors to the Club who can be supplied with and/or sold alcohol for consumption on the Club premises. Their names must be entered in the Visitors Book kept in the bar, together with the name of the Member introducing them.

d) Members may introduce up to three playing guests at one time.

e) A playing visitor must report to the Club Professional, or any other designated person, before commencing play and pay the appropriate fee.

5. VISITING SOCIETIES

Visiting societies must make arrangements with the Club Secretary or Club Professional regarding their playing arrangements and fees

6. CHILDREN

a) Children who are not members must be seven years of age or over before they are allowed on the course and must be accompanied by a responsible adult

b) During summer opening hours children are allowed in the Clubhouse up to 10.00 p.m. in an evening. At other times children must not be in the Clubhouse after 8.00 p.m. in the evening. Children should not be in the clubhouse when there is an evening social event on unless they have been specifically invited.

7. COURSE

Fishing is not permitted in the ponds on the course. Fishing in the river must be by agreement with the Club Secretary.

8. CLUBHOUSE

No food or drink must be brought into the Clubhouse for consumption unless it has been specifically agreed with the Club Secretary.

9. MEMBERSHIP

All members who have reached the age of 80 will be entitled to any arrangements for reduced subscriptions being offered to other members.

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
