
The Warreners always enjoy the Xmas invitation and we would like to thank our guests for playing and for the company at the festivities afterwards.

the recent wet weather Rob Barrett and his greenkeepers have done a magnificent job throughout the last two months. The temporary tees aren't ideal but have helped players avoid the worst of the boggy areas. To help further I would ask you all to keep any wheeled vehicle as far away from the greens as possible even if it involves some temporary inconveniences! In particular don't venture between greens and the bunkers around them. Additionally avoid the fringes of greens such as to the right of the seventh green and take wheels through deeper rough even if it's a little boggier. Thanks in anticipation of your extra care!

We've brought most of the new banking around the greenkeepers area into play and you may now only obtain free relief (at the nearest playable point) from embedded surface stones and muddy chunks! We will be mowing these banks in early spring. Meanwhile balls are findable and playable much more so

than prior to the banking being reconstructed.

Meanwhile the landfill saga continues. John A'Court is extending the club's initial 3 year planning approval beyond March for a further 3 years. However, in seeking a Permit to bring in the volume of material required Lynch have come up against a recent new court judgement passed in

2015 which requires us to answer a further series of Environment Agency questions in order to satisfy the administrative iobsworths in the Agency to cover their backsides! I guess you can sense my frustration! More anon.
