

We expect the County Council finally to adjudicate on our application to extend

our landfill plans sometime before mid June. Thanks are due to John A'Court who has assisted in communication with the Council notably over the objections received from neighbours and the Town Council. Given approval we will liaise with C J Lynch to secure their permits to bring in the landfill which will subsequently enable us to reassess expenditure plans for the course and the Club in general.

Rob Barrett and I have met with Alan Bissell to help him to understand the recent phasing of course expenditures which have led to a recent over expenditure against

budget but which will readjust to be on budget later in the year.

I have had discussions with several individuals who have expressed an interest in shooting rabbits. When I have fully assessed their experience and their licences a number of them will be granted approval to proceed with shooting. We will still be left with some problem with rabbit control until such time as we have repaired and extended the existing Finances have rabbit fencing. prevented us taking action on this issue but recommencing landfill deliveries may help with this although it will still be a major expense which will have to be dealt with by only 3 greenkeepers - we had 5 when the fencing was originally constructed!

During May we replaced 3 inoperative greens' sprinkler system control boxes which will improve timed watering to the benefit of play around the greens during the day. Some members have commented on the need for a "second cut" to prevent balls rolling straight into the rough from fairways. Right now the equipment available to us and the availability of green keeping time to attend to this do not permit resolving this issue satisfactorily but we strive to give attention to things as best we can! Meanwhile please be aware that misdirected balls may no longer be prevented from going out of bounds by chicken wire at the base of the fencing – if your ball disappears off course it's your own fault!

I have a very special request for all members to give very special attention to NOT taking wheeled trolleys and in particular ride-on buggies close to the proximity of greens. Notably please do NOT go between greens and greenside bunkers, follow paths wherever possible and use the new parking areas beside the 2nd and 14th greens at all times. Also please avoid obviously worn areas which have been caused by previous failures to follow these principles of good management. New white lines restricting access to greens have been recently marked.

Please make prompt payment in order to help with administration.


Book your place!
