Christmas Opening hours

Drop zone on the 3rd

Due to the extreme weather, we have reintroduced the drop zone on the 3rd hole. This drop zone is compulsory and you may place your ball within this area. Further signage is now in place.

Planning news

Unbelievably, Mendip Council are now saying that they forgot to ask the Archaeological Society as well as Historic England about our planning. We are hopeful that the historical survey we had done will cover this but it has still pushed the planning decision back again!

Office Space Available

Driving Range

During the winter months it may also be necessary to 'hand collect' the driving range balls. This takes place when the ground is too wet to use the ball collector. Please understand that this may mean the range is closed for a period of usually one hour. The timings on this depend on availability of staff but we try to keep disruption to a minimum. Timings will generally be 11.15am – 12.15pm weekdays and 1.00pm – 2.00pm weekends. During wet periods, please call the golf shop on ext 110 if you intend to use the range.

Winter conditions

Winter Course changes

The start of full winter course changes were implemented on Thursday 29th November (Monday 20th November last year). All winter mats are in play and there are shortened holes on 1st, 4th, 7th, 12th and 17th. (16th until tee is back in use following works.)

As UK temperatures drop, grass growth slows and therefore course recovery does not occur. With up to 200 golfers per day trudging across the course, it is very easy to ruin all the hard work that takes place during the season.

We are fortunate to have buggy paths to help move golfers around the course as well as free draining greens to keep temporary greens to a minimum. Ropes and hoops are also used to direct traffic away from the problem areas where possible. We will bring back to normality as soon as ground conditions and temperatures permit.

Course closures

For prolonged periods of heavy rain or snow, it is sometimes necessary to close some or all of the course. This decision is based on the ground conditions and is made by the greenkeeping team first thing in the morning. If they feel the course is waterlogged and damage can be done or there is a risk to golfers, they will close the necessary holes. This decision is never taken lightly but, as in previous years, it will happen at various times through the winter. News from the course with Andy Grabham

What a busy month!!

November has seen the weather go from mild to cold, back to mild and now mild and very wet and windy.

This has thrown some challenges during this month especially with us starting the changes on 12th and 16th holes.

Leaves have continued to fall with just the big oak trees left to fall. We have had a few problems with the machines that help move and collect the leaves of late, this has hampered our efforts to keep on top of them (sorry for any lost balls). Also with the works starting on the 12th and 16th, the machinery used for construction are also the ones used for collecting and moving leaves, therefore leading us to prioritise the vehicles to construction while the weather was dry. We will get out ASAP when the rain stops to tidy the course up from leaves.

I'm still happy with the greens surfaces going into the winter although there is a bit of disease on a few greens again!! This is unstoppable in these conditions where spraying is not possible and climatic conditions are perfect for pathogen and spore reproduction. I have sprayed preventives and can guarantee if we hadn't sprayed and carried out aeration practices of late the disease outbreak would be a lot more devastating. I have solid tined the greens and have put on a granule fertiliser, this will breakdown quickly, especially with the rain around. In return this will provide the plants with the nutrients they need going into winter.

From now on and for the rest of the winter the greens will be hand cut at 6mm and turf ironed on occasions.

News from the course with Andy Grabham

The full winter course is now in play with shortened holes on 1,4,7,12,16,17, this is due to health and safety from steep terrain and wet areas that we need to protect for next season. Please follow all signage and stay on paths as much as possible. Buggies are to remain on paths at all times now, apart from 11,13 and 14 where you can drive in the rough as directed. Any course furniture moved for the playing of your shot should be replaced when finished please. 16th works are well underway with the white and yellow tee complete, apart from seeding the remaining bank and putting in irrigation (great effort by the boys to get this done in 7days, as well as preparing the course each day). The old green/yellow tee has been levelled to the path height, we will create a smaller green tee at the back of the old yellow tee. The weather has been against us with the latest storms, which has stopped our efforts for now. Work on planting trees and finishing the tees will continue when conditions allow us. The 12th tee construction is well underway and is starting to take shape. The new design will create a bigger teeing ground area, lower maintenance and a real feature to our feature hole. Obviously with construction comes interruption and mess!! We will do our best to localise the damage and repair it when complete. Please play all traffic marks and construction areas as GUR until further notice. We will keep you all updated on progress on these projects as much as possible, will post on social media photos and progress along the way. Regards

Ball Flight Law 2– Swing Path

Each time you make a golf swing, there are 2 factors that determine the direction and the flight path of the golf ball. One is your **swing path** and the other is the **club face angle** at impact. I talked about club face angle last week, this week it's the turn of swing path.

Swing path is the path or direction that the golf club travels during the downswing and through impact with the golf ball. Whenever we talk about swing path, it's always in relation to the **ball-to-target line** (see the image to the right)

There are only ever 3 possible swing paths relative to our ball-to-target line:

- **Out-to-in** - the club head travels from outside the target line, across it, and then inside the target line. In effect, the path of the club is travelling to the **left** of the ball-to-target line.

- **In-to-out** - the club head travels from inside the target line, across it, and then outside the target line. So the path of the club is travelling to the **right** of the ball-to-target line.

- **Straight** - the club head travels straight down the ball-to-target line as it makes contact with the ball.



Prepare your Putting *Lower your score by 5 shots*

Putting is one of, if not the most important part of the game and can save lots of shots with a little bit of coaching and practice. I've got 3 key putting practice routines I would like you to try before the on:

Distance Control

1. Start off 2 feet from the hole with 20 balls or less and try to sink as many as you can. Take a pace back and repeat this process until you are as far away from the hole as you can get.

Scoring

2. Play 9 holes around the putting green and try to achieve the lowest score possible then record your score, with your next go try to beat your score.

Pressure Putts

3. Position 20 balls 2 feet from the hole and try to sink them all in a row if one is missed you have to start again. When you have to hole that 20th putt you certainly feel some pressure. This definitely will help to handle some of the pressure 's experienced on the course. If you this comes easy to you increase the amount of putts, but do exceed 100.

Many entered into the spirit of the day by wearing fancy dress or dressing up in Pudsey style spots and stripes attire.

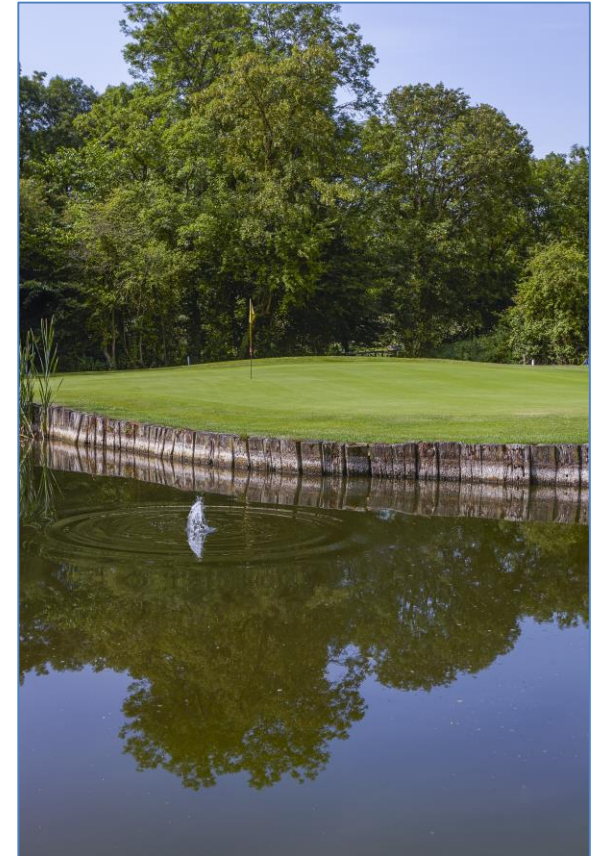

SHATTERED SENIORS SURRENDER SHERBORNE SHIELD

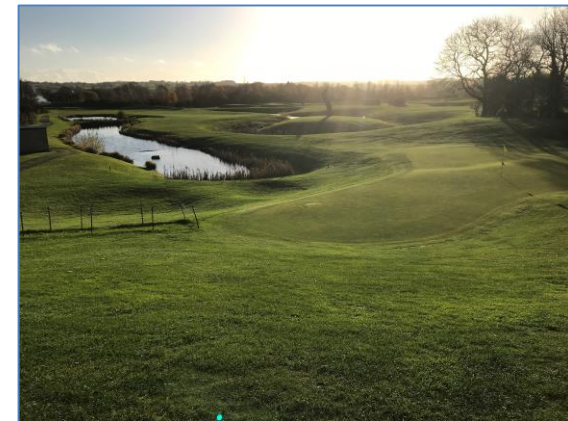
