NOTES FOR CLUBS AND CAPTAINS

Welcome to Derbyshire County Golf Ladies' Bronze and Silver Trophy and Inter-club Foursomes Competitions 2019.

We hope this information pack will be helpful for Clubs and Team Captains.

Please could Team Captains send each of us an email before the start of the season, stating their club and which team they are captaining. This would enable us to set up specific email contact lists and only contact individuals with relevant information.

Based on our experiences last year, we would like to draw your attention to the following:

- Trophy Team Captains should be familiar with the competition rules prior to their first match, in particular the rules relating to course closures on match days, and rules relating to penalties for not fielding a team.
- Clubs entering the Trophy Competitions may be asked to host semi-finals and finals. The dates should therefore be included on club fixture cards and tee times (12:45pm to 2:45pm) provisionally reserved. The Trophy Secretary will endeavour to finalise the venues as early as possible, although this will depend on the draw and on division results.

We are almost paperless! Photos of Trophy match results sheets should be sent to the Match Secretaries by text or email. Contact details are on the bottom of the match results sheets.

The Trophy Match Results sheet has been tweaked – hopefully to make it easier to complete and process. Feedback is welcome at the end of the season.

- 1. Clubs to be divided into **4 divisions** each year as determined by a random draw of all teams. The **winners of each division** will take part in a **semi-final**. The **two winners** of the **semi-finals** will play in the **final**.
- 2. A player who is a member of more than one club affiliated to DCG can only play for one club during the season. The player to decide which club she represents.
- 3. Clubs to play home and away matches with every club in their Division unless prevented by course closure (see Rules 13 and 14).
- 4. The host club Team Captain is responsible for arrangements and should contact the visiting Team Captain prior to the match to confirm arrangements and notify her of any temporary greens/bunkers out of play etc. Provision of refreshments is at the discretion of individual clubs and should be agreed with the visiting Captain prior to the match. The Team Captains are responsible for all rulings or decisions on the day of the match.
- 5. Number of players in a team to be five.
- Matches to start at 1.30pm, but may start at a mutually suitable time with prior agreement of the two Team Captains involved. If this proves impossible please contact the Match Secretary.
- 7. Matches to be played on full difference of handicap. Active CONGU competition handicap certificates must be made available on day of play.
- 8. Players to play in order of their exact playing handicaps. Penalty for non-observance of this regulation is loss of individual game. If two or more players in a team hold the same exact handicap, the Captain of that team is responsible for their order of play.
- 9. If a player arrives more than five minutes after the *last* tee time, or does not arrive, her intended opponent receives a walkover (see Rule 8 Order of Play). There may be an alteration of playing order but once team sheets have been exchanged, no deviation from the pairings may be made. (*R&A Rule 6-3a Time of starting. The player must start at the time established by the Committee*)
- 10. a) If fewer than five play, walkovers are to be given in the games not played. Teams unable to field five players should inform their opposition and the Match Secretary in advance; in which case walkovers will be declared by the Match Secretary and opposition players who are not needed do not have to attend. Once declared walkovers cannot be rescinded.
 - b) Any club giving five walkovers in a match shall have six points deducted from their total points at the end of the competition.

- 11. A maximum of 6 temporary greens are acceptable providing the hole is the regulation 4¼ inches (i.e. no "bucket" holes). The DCG Competitions Committee reserves the right to waive this rule
- 12. Any appeals should be made to the Match Secretary immediately by telephone or email; or if not available to the DCG Competitions Committee via The County Secretary.
- 13. Once a match has been arranged it <u>must be played unless the course is closed</u> (R&A Rule 33- 2d), <u>or the use of trolleys is banned.</u> If this occurs for the first match between the teams and the away course is open, the dates for home and away matches must be swapped. If the home course is closed for play on the date fixed for the second meeting of the teams, the opponents' course must be used if available, even when teams have already completed a match on that course.
- 14. Details of any changes in date or venue must be sent to the Trophy Match Secretary as soon as possible.
- 15. In the event of temporary suspension of play due to severe weather conditions, play must be resumed if possible by 4.30pm. If at 4:30pm, the course is declared unplayable it can only be a temporary suspension, and play must be resumed from where it was discontinued, even though resumption occurs on a subsequent day (R&A Rule 6-8).
- 16. If resumption of play is to be arranged for a subsequent day, the match must be arranged for the soonest day possible.
- 17. Every effort must be made by the teams to find such a date so that the match can be completed. If any of the players who played in the suspended match are unable to play on the resumption date they may be replaced (in line with rule 3). The same players, however, should try to be available if possible. In the event of replacement, each individual match involving new player(s) must have stroke allowances re-calculated and re-start at the first hole. Where this occurs Rule 7 (playing in order of handicap) does not apply.
- 18. In the event that a match is not completed, the DCG Competitions Committee will come to an equitable decision to achieve a result. Any decision made by the DCG Competitions Committee is final.
- 19. Individual matches halved on the 18th green to be counted as a half.
- 20. a) Clubs are awarded 2 points for a win, 1 point for a half and 0 for a loss
 - b) In the event of a tie at the end of the season, the team(s) to go forward to the semi-finals will be determined on count-back of games won in each match. Halved matches to be counted as a half and included in the total.
- 21. Electronic copy of the result sheet of the Silver and Bronze team matches, signed by both Captains, is to be sent by the host Captain to the Match Secretary as soon as possible after the match.

- 22. The result is deemed to be announced when both Team Captains have signed the match sheets.
- 23. Supporters are welcome at all rounds of the competition, but they <u>must</u> keep their distance and <u>not</u> interfere with play, distract players of either team or offer advice.
- 24. All **Semi-final and Final** matches must have clear winners. Individual matches ending in a tie will play the next and subsequent holes in a sudden death play-off until there is a clear winner.
- 25. A neutral representative of the DCG Competitions Committee will be present at the Finals.
- 26. R&A Rule 6-7. Undue delay; slow play: The player must play without undue delay and in accordance with any Pace of Play guidelines that the Committee may establish. Between completion of a hole and playing from the next teeing ground, the player must not unduly delay play.
- 27. Use of Buggies.

Players needing to use a buggy for <u>medical reasons</u> may do so without a medical certificate. Hiring the buggy and ensuring that buggies are allowed on the day of the competition (ground conditions etc) will be the responsibility of the player. The player's Team Captain could, as a matter of courtesy, inform the opposing Team Captain.

Silver Division

Handicap limit 20(c)

Players with handicaps higher than 20 may compete but must play off a maximum handicap of **20**. (For players with handicaps of more than 20 who compete in Silver Division Matches the calculated handicap allowance will be full difference of the maximum handicap of 20).

For clubs entering more than one team in the Silver Division, players may play for <u>one</u> of those teams only; once they have played for that team they may not then play for the other Silver Division team.

Bronze Division

Handicaps **21**(c) **–36**(c)

For clubs entering more than one team in the Bronze Division, players may play for <u>one</u> of those teams only; once they have played for that team they may not then play for the other Bronze Division team.

Bronze players may play in one Bronze and one Silver Division team.

One club shall play against another as determined by the random draw of all teams made at the July County Committee Meeting and on dates confirmed at that Meeting. However, if the course with the Home draw is unavailable because of a prior booking by the club, then the team captains can mutually agree to either arrange an <u>earlier</u> date on the Home course or agree to play on the Away course on the due date and at the appointed time.

- 1. On the day of the match, if the Home course is declared unplayable at the time fixed, or the use of trollies is banned, then the Away course must be used as a first option if it is available. If the Away course is unavailable, then both team captains can mutually agree on an alternative date and time prior to the date set for the following round of the competition. If neither course is available, the Match Secretary shall be responsible for arranging the match within six days. The Match Secretary must be informed of any changes.
- 2. Each club shall be represented by four players with active CONGU handicaps. Active CONGU handicap certificates must be made available on the day of play.
- 3. Matches to start at **1.00pm**. If both Divisions on the same Course: Silver Division 1.00pm and Bronze Division 1.20pm or by special arrangement with the Match Secretary. (R&A Rule 6-3a Time of starting. The player must start at the time established by the Committee)
- 4. Pairs to play in combined playing handicap order. If combined playing handicaps are the same, combined exact handicaps should be used to determine the playing order. If these are the same, the Team Captain will decide the order. **BEFORE play commences** both team captains **must**:
 - a. Confirm playing handicaps
 - b. Agree playing order
 - c. Agree strokes received/given
 - 5. If a player arrives more than five minutes after the *last* tee time, or does not arrive, her intended opponent receives a walkover (see Rule 8 Order of Play). There may be an alteration of playing order but once team sheets have been exchanged, no deviation from the pairings may be made. (R&A Rule 6-3a Time of starting. The player must start at the time established by the Committee)
- 6. The result is deemed to be confirmed when both Team Captains have signed the match sheets.
- 7. The competition shall be foursomes on handicap, the limit being **40** combined in the Silver Division and **60** combined in the Bronze Division. A Bronze player may play in one Bronze and one Silver Division team if necessary, but must play off a maximum of **20** handicap in the Silver Division. Handicap allowance: ½ the difference between the total combined handicap of each pair.
- 8. Each pair shall play one round of **all** 18 holes and the club having won most holes on the combined result of the two matches shall progress into the next round.
- 9. In the event of a tie in any round both pairs shall play three more holes. If the score is still all square, there will be a sudden death playoff by both pairs on the next and subsequent holes until there is a clear winner.
- 10. A club need not be represented by the same four players throughout the course of the competition.
- 11. A player is not eligible to play for two clubs during the competition.

- 12. The host club Lady Captain is responsible for arrangements and should contact the visiting Lady Captain prior to the match to confirm arrangements and notify her of any temporary greens/bunkers out of play etc. Provision of refreshments is at the discretion of individual clubs and should be agreed with the visiting Captain prior to the match. The Team Captain is responsible for all rulings or decisions on the day of the match.
- 13. A maximum of 6 temporary greens are acceptable providing the hole is the regulation 4¼ inches (i.e. no "bucket" holes). The County Executive reserves the right to waive this rule.
- 14. The result of each match must be telephoned to the Match Secretary, by the winners, directly the match is finished, and the result sheet, signed by both Captains, posted to her immediately.
- 15. In the event of temporary suspension of play due to severe weather conditions, play must be resumed if possible by 4.30pm. If then the course is declared unplayable it can only be a temporary suspension, and play must be resumed from where it was discontinued, even though resumption occurs on a subsequent day (R&A Rule 6-8).
- 16. If resumption of play is to be arranged for a subsequent day, the match must be arranged for the soonest day possible before the date of the next round.
- 17. Every effort must be made by the teams to find such a date so that the match can be completed. If any of the players who played in the suspended match are unable to play on the resumption date they may be replaced (in line with rule 3). In such circumstances each individual match involving new player(s) must have stroke allowances re-calculated and restart at the first hole.
- 18. If however it proves impossible to arrange a resumption due to course unavailability both Team Captains are to report to the Match Secretary.
- 19. In the event that a match is not completed the Executive Committee will come to an equitable decision to achieve a result. Any decision made by the County Executive is final.
- 20. The **Semi-Finals** and **Finals** of both Silver and Bronze Divisions shall be over 18 holes on **neutral** courses. Tee times will be determined by the host club.
- 21. In all Semi-Finals and Finals of Inter-Club Foursome matches if the course is closed then the two captains must accept the first date and time offered by the neutral host club.
- 22. A neutral representative of the Executive Committee will be present at the Finals.
- 23. R&A Rule 6-7. Undue delay; slow play. The player must play without undue delay and in accordance with any Pace of Play guidelines that the Committee may establish. Between completion of a hole and playing from the next teeing ground, the player must not unduly delay play.
- 24. Supporters are welcome at all rounds of the competition, but they must keep their distance and not interfere with play, distract players of either team or offer advice.

Silver Division

Handicap limit 20 Players with handicaps higher than 20 may compete but must play off a maximum handicap of 20.

Bronze Division

Handicaps 21–36
