LADIES SCARTH MEDAL

Background

The Scarth Medal was originally the Tripe donated by Mrs W Scarth in 1963. It was called the Tripe because Mrs Scarth asked a lady member how she had played and was told 'like tripe'. In 1982 after the death of Eva Scarth her daughter, Mrs Brenda Todd, presented a Scottish Quaich for the winner and the name of the competition was changed to the Scarth Medal.

Format History

It was originally match play knockout but changed to stroke in 1962 by Mrs Scarth's daughter in law, Mrs Eva Scarth, the winner receiving a statuette of a lady golfer.

Current

18 Holes Stroke. Red Tees. Full Handicap.

There are 6 rounds in this competition, one per month from April to September, combined with any other stroke play competition.

The winner of the monthly Scarth Medal round will hold the Scarth Brooch until the next monthly round.

The aggregate of the best 3 cards determines the outright winner for the season. The outright winner will hold the brooch until the first round of the next season.
