The Warreners

Apologies for missing last month's newsletter and I will now report on two

months of Warreners events.

On August 3rd the Warreners played at home against Worlebury Golf Club at Minehead and lost 4-2 but



nevertheless it was a very pleasant day's golf. The fixture goes back a long way, in fact to the days of Geoff Barrett who instigated the fixture with John Wood from Worlebury resulting in keenly fought matches for a trophy made by John Wood. Unfortunately Worlebury have won the trophy on more occasions than the Warreners.

On 17th August the Warreners played against the North Devon Police but due to pressure of work, holidays and unhelpful shifts the police could only field a team of eight so two Warreners played for the police. This ploy didn't work as the Police won 4 -2.

Members of the Warreners played for the Geoff Barrett tankards on the 24th August, a four ball better ball Stableford competition. The competition was won by Mike Lee and Robin Miles with 48 points.

On 31st August the Warreners played against Minehead Seniors and won 4 1/2 - 1 1/2 on a very nice day followed by a great meal served by Graham our chef who we feel is providing some excellent food. The Seniors and Warreners feel that these internal club competitions are very important by bringing extra revenue to the club via the kitchen and the bar

The Warreners were due to play the Royal Naval Air Station, Yeovilton at Minehead on 7th September but the Navy are struggling to find members for their society and couldn't raise a team so it appears they will probably cease to exist as a golf society. On September 14th the Warreners played Brean Golf Club at Minehead where the Warreners won 4 1/2 - 1 1/2 against a strong team.

On Monday 26th September the Warreners were due to play Chivenor at Minehead but Chivenor cancelled due to their concerns about a horrendous weather forecast. The fixture is to be rearranged during November.

The Warreners were due to play Minehead Ladies on 28th September but there were problems with the date and the fixture has now been rearranged for 2nd November. The Warreners still have fixtures to fulfil throughout October and November so we hope the weather is kind to us.



The Course, Graham J Wells

I am still awaiting some answers from my questions of the Waste Planning concerning their requirements for final approval of our plans for landfill. Landfill income cannot be expected until early next year as a result, but we'll get there eventually!

A member had suggested we may be able to bring in soil under the heading of "landscaping" which Sherborne had done without the planning need for approval. Unfortunately Sherborne's activities took place as part of major improvements to their 9 most recently renewed holes and did not soil deliveries require inconveniencing neighbours. In our case any large scale soil deliveries must pass close to the cottages at the entrance to the course and would require approval in any circumstance!

Night time rabbit shooting has begun and although the nuisance has been reduced at the far ends of the course this will have to be an ongoing activity until such time as we can afford to install more comprehensive fencing. In the interim the greenkeepers will be repairing some of the fencing at the clubhouse end as time permits.

Rob Barrett has identified that the subtly raised contours of the ground around some greens is preventing water from running off the greens in periods of very wet weather resulting in pooling of water on these greens. To try to alleviate this we have decided to skim off some of the topsoil in limited areas as follows:

Front left of the fringe to the 4th green. Front left of the fringe to the 6th green. Short left of the 7th green Middle left of the 8th green.

These relatively small areas will be dealt with one at a time between now and Xmas so as to cause the minimum of disruption and each will be marked as GUR for a short time. We plan to apply Winter Rules when BST ends on October 30th unless wet weather is anticipated between times in which case members will be notified of an earlier date.

Finally, as some of you are aware I have had some health issues which have prevented my playing and otherwise being at the club for the past 3 months. This situation is likely to continue until the spring but for now I can always be contacted if you need me on my mobile, by text or by email even if I'm around the club less frequently.
