
We Warreners hope everybody at Minehead golf club has enjoyed a good

In the absence of this income we've been unable to reconstruct the bunkers on holes 1. 18.9 and 10 as we would have liked at this time. However, we've started the improvements to paths on the 14th hole. The standard of path you see there is that which badly needs to apply on all paths on the course especially as we now have to accommodate the 2 seater buggies for hire.

Please keep looking on notice boards for comments on any new course issues arising.


Next Club Night.
