# Competitions 2017

- ► The competitions calendar was kept similar to recent years in order to take advantage of better course conditions and longer daylight hours for the major competitions.
- ► The Captain's Prize was played in July
  - Played on consecutive weekends
  - 303 people played on The Montgomerie Course in Captain's Day 1
  - The top 120 qualifying to play in Day 2 on The O'Meara Course with their scores carrying forward
  - ► Congratulations to Ciaran Dunne who came out on top
  - ▶ 118 people played in The Captain's Plate and was won by Oisin Devereux
- ► The Presidents Prize was played in June
  - ► Competition opened on the Friday afternoon again this year
  - ▶ 190 played in the competition which was won by Jim Stanley
- ► The Scratch Cups were played on consecutive weekends in August/September
  - David Fulham won the Senior Scratch Cup
  - ▶ JP Linnane won the Junior Scratch Cup
  - Joe Reilly won the Intermediate Scratch Cup
  - Declan Ward won the Minor Scratch Cup
- ► The Autumn League ran for five weeks with the best four scores counting.
  - ► This competition was won by Adrian Guckian



# Competitions cont...

- ► The Coonan Cup was played as a Matchplay played over one week.
  - ▶ Top 16 qualifiers qualifiers available to play into a matchplay
  - Seamus Lynch was the overall winner
- Weekend 18-hole qualifying competitions began in April
  - ▶ an average of 200 played in the weekend competitions
  - ▶ 8 Medal competitions scheduled during 2017 with an average of 215 playing
- ▶ The Golfer of the Year competition format was similar to last year
  - every weekend competition counting along with the Matchplay competitions, Medals and the Majors
  - David Fulham won the Golfer of the Year competition
- ► The current Winter League started in December 2017 and will run until the end of February 2018.
  - A similar format was kept to last year with four divisions and the winner of each division going forward to a playoff in March

- Details of prizes are submitted to the Golf Shop. We are aware that there were some delays during the year in crediting prizes to the cards. This was due an administrative issue at the Golf Shop end. We are satisfied that the matter has now been resolved and apologise to any members affected.
- Going forward, we have asked the PLC for a facility for members to review transactions on their cards and understand that the IT system requirements necessary to facility this check have been included in the wider Development proposal.
- ▶ Weekend prizes for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, Gross, top 3 in 4 Divisions, Front 9 and Back 9
- Over 330 members won prizes during the year

# Handicaps

- The Handicap Committee for 2017 comprised of:-Paul Mullarkey (Secretary), Sheamus Considine, Seamus Thompson
- ► The Handicap Committee monitors and manages Carton member handicaps in line with the CONGU rules and GUI guidance and tries on behalf of the Committee and membership to ensure the spirit of fair play in handicaps is assured for the total membership of Carton. The Handicap Committee is also the main liaison body for the GUI and is responsible for the dissemination of handicap and ruling updates to the membership.
- ▶ We currently have 482 members (October 17) on the Handicap database, of which 455 are managed as "Home" and 27 as "Away" Members.
- ▶ Handicaps are managed in line with normal domestic and external competition results, in addition to which, there were two handicap reviews carried out in 2107. The purpose of the reviews is to identify players whose general playing performance and scoring patterns is at variance with the norm in their Handicap Category and who as a consequence might be considered for a handicap reduction/increase. Based on the Review details, recommendations for handicap adjustments are made to the GUI who in turn may ratify, amend or reject the recommendations.



# Handicaps cont...

- ► The Annual Review of Handicaps took place in November 2017. The GUI accepted the Carton Report after 3 amendments were made and 48 players were approved for adjustments. (8 for reduction and 40 for increase). 7 members declined the increase.
- ► The previous handicap review was conducted in Apr 2017. A number of downward adjustments arose from this review.
- A number of these downward adjustments were appealed to a Carton Handicap Appeals committee (CHAC) (an independent committee set up for the purpose and made up of the hon Sec, the Ex Officio Captain and a past captain). The CHAC reviewed the available evidence, the relevant CONGU guidelines and the handicap processes and on the basis of this review, upheld the decision of the Handicap Committee and confirmed the handicap reductions.
- A number of member's whose handicaps were cut appealed the findings of the CHAC to the Leinster branch of the GUI. After submissions by all parties, these appeals were upheld and the handicap reductions were reversed.
- ▶ The Handicap Committee engaged with the GUI with a view to understanding the basis of the appeal ruling which, on the face of it, seemed to be at variance with the CONGU guidelines. The GUI has now provided further guidance which relates primarily to recording competition condition details and the Handicap Committee is currently reviewing its procedures with a view to providing an enhanced evidence pool which can form the basis for the Annual Handicap Review process.

## Communication

- ▶ The communication objective for 2017 was to ensure that members were fully informed, on a timely basis, of all relevant information and developments. Regular ongoing communication focussed on fixtures, club events, team news and social functions. The main communication channel in 2017 was by e mail, via the Club V1 system. Throughout 2017, in excess of 100 separate communications were sent out with approx 290 members reading each of these e mails
- The biggest challenge on the communications front in 2017 was the sale of Carton House. The Men's Club were, understandably, not privy to the sales process and the PLC were restricted, for legal reasons, in what information they could divulge. Despite the best efforts of the Men's Club, there was very little in the line of reportable information available on the progress of the sale and the net result was widespread rumour and uncertainty which was extremely frustrating both for the members and for the Men's committee alike.
- As part of our efforts around the sales process, the committee conducted a survey of members which was customised to provide specific information for the committee in anticipation of engaging with the new owners. The survey drew a huge response which very clearly showed the interest and concern of the members and which highlighted the frustration of the membership across the key flashpoint issues.
- On the back of the survey results, the committee help a Town Hall meeting in mid November with a view to teasing out further the comments expressed in the survey and to canvas members views about the approaches we might adopt and the priorities we might identify with the new owners of Carton. This also proved to be a very useful forum and sincere thanks to all who contributed on the night. As you will have seen in the recent comms, the views expressed at Town Hall meeting have been consolidated with the other feedback received and this is now being incorporated into the estate wide development proposal to be sent to the Mullen family for decision.



# Communication cont....

- As a result of the success of the initial survey, we would propose to use this as part of our communication platform in 2018. The plan is undertake another Club Survey in 2018 to include some standardised questions which can be used to establish reference points which can be used for comparative purposes.
- The Club V1 system will continue to be the main communication channel and members are asked to ensure that their correct e mail address is included in your renewal documentation or through contacting the Men's Club at mensclub@cartonhousemembers.com
- ▶ Direct contact is also an important part of the communication process with over 400 emails received during 2017. Your input and comments are always welcome and we would encourage you to contact the committee if you have a matter or suggestion that you would like to raise.

- The objective for 2018 is to ensure that members are kept fully informed of all relevant information on a timely basis.
  - The challenge for 2018 is to make our communications more relevant and informative and in this regard members feedback & thoughts are more than welcome

### Challenges/Plans for 2018 cont

- ► The aim is to update weekend results by the following Monday.
- ► There are legacy issues with a number of member e mail addresses on the Club V1 system. Significant remediation work has been done in this regard in 2017 and the objective for 2018 is to ensure that the member e mail database is complete and accurate.
  - A new Club V1 app. will be rolled out early in 2018 which allows members to update their contact details on Club V1. The system will also allow short notification messages to be sent to members and it would be our aspiration to develop this as an additional communication channel
- One communication channel which needs an overhaul is the Club Website which needs updating in terms of content and presentation. A review is planned for 2018 and the Committee would certainly welcome the help of any members who are proficient in this area to help with this task.
