Unfortunately, our signature tree on the island to the right of the 8th green has lost a large branch in the Summer heat. Please take care when retrieving balls as the other branch does not look very sturdy either. We are reviewing the situation and will let you know shortly.





News from the course with Andy Grabham

A tough Summer of weather for turf is coming to an end. The recent rainfall along with the irrigation system fixed again, means the golf course is greening up again!! Its crazy how quickly the grass goes from hibernation to lush green growth in a short space of time.

A lot of areas are recovering well, but some may take a lot longer or may not recover at all. The patchy growth around the course will take some time to fill back in again. We will force some areas on with fertiliser and seed if needs be.

With the stresses the greens have been under from high temps and lack of water at times, unfortunately its a recipe for disease outbreaks. Anthracnose and Fusarium (bottom left) outbreaks at the moment are a combination of prolonged wet weather, sustained humid/warm 24hr periods, weak etiolated growth and a lack of spray opportunities. Fortunately the soil temperatures are still high enough to grow these out quickly, We have sprayed chemicals to help speed this process up and should over the next week or so see the greens recover fully. We are entering a very high disease pressure period of the year, its a constant battle to get the timings right to try and prevent these outbreaks. Golf traffic and Mother Nature are the main issues we have to work around. Figures crossed for a dry winter!!



News from the course with Andy Grabham

Solid tining at different depths will be taking place at least monthly from September onwards, this is essential for drainage, getting oxygen to the roots, drier and firmer surfaces, root development and microbial life. Sorry for any disruption, we will keep this to a minimal where possible.

Due to an official complaint from the occupants in the house left of the 16th hole regarding balls entering their property, We are looking to make changes to minimize any risk. We have grown the rough in from the left and the fairway has been reshaped (outlined by a dotted white line for cutting purposes), its not GUR. Also the out of bounds has been brought in from the left and is marked by whites stakes and posts.

Any further details of changes to the hole will be sent out to all members. Please refrain from hitting into the property at

all times.

Monthly Photo Competition


Thank you to all members who sent pictures to us last month. It was a hard decision but the panel felt this one was the winner.


