## **Ron's Remarkable Rule Revelation of the month**

Each month, Ron Cowper a qualified EGU club rules official, offers a clarification or explanation of a particular rule of golf.

#### This month: CORRECTLY MARKING THE BALL ON A PUTTING GREEN

Q. A player rotates his or her ball on the putting green after marking the position of the ball with his or her finger. Is this permitted?

A. No. The player is penalised one stroke under Rule 9.4b for not first marking the ball's spot with an artificial object, such as a tee, a coin, an object made to be a ball-marker or another small piece of equipment.
