

Tee and Fairway Green





Pro's Tip

Intimidating from the tee, but there is more room than there appears. A driver may not be the right club here as the further you go, the narrower it gets. Try to play about 195 yards from the tee and you will be left with a short iron up to the green. The green itself slopes steeply from back to front and you do not want to be past the pin, otherwise you will be left with a very fast putt.

Pro's Tip

A par five that is a cerebral test. Play your drive to favour the left side of the fairway from the tee – then your second should favour the left side as well. Allow for the slope of this right to left fairway. This will then leave an approach shot to a long, sunken green with a tier in the middle up to another level. Correct club selection here is essential to have two putts or less so select your club carefully to match the pin position. A par here is always a great score.

Pro's Tip

Intimidating from the tee, but keep a cool head and you may have a chance of a birdie on this great short hole. With the green sloping from back to front, you do not want to be past the pin, but on the other hand, short can be disaster – so choose your club carefully and if courage eludes you, long left is the safest route.

Pro's Tip

Again, another tee shot over the quarry with the emphasis on accuracy rather than length. Long hitters should aim at or just right of the marker post, whilst mortals can afford to be left without being penalised. The second is difficult as it is another approach where you do not want to be long as there is lots of trouble beyond the green – play for the front is the safe ploy especially in dry, running conditions. Beware of the Holywell bounce!

Pro's Tip

Driver is not the percentage play here as the fairway narrows after 200 yards. Ideally, play to the marker post area (or just left rather than right) and have a short iron to a green that is below you and slopes from front to back. Only the brave will go for the pin if it is on the back-left portion – better to play for the front of the green and rely on your putter.

Pro's Tip

A classic finishing hole! An accurate tee shot is needed here with OOB on the right and heather left. Play at or just right of the marker post. You will then have another testing approach where playing for the front of the green gives you the safest option as the green slopes from front to back.
