Tom Boyle (13) and Simon Bradburn (21) were second with 29 points, 2 points ahead of John Drumey (10) and Geoff Otty (14) in third place and Gareth Whiles (9) and Peter Chambers (19) in fourth. Tony McGibbon (12) and Jonathan Langham (14) were awarded the last of the prizes in fifth place, being the best of several pairs on 26 points. There were only 4 twos scored all day, so an excellent TwosClub dividend of 11 balls per two this week.

Storm Brendan's heavy wind and rain deterred a lot of Pannal Ladies from entering last Tuesday's individual stableford over 9 holes, with just 10 intrepid competitors venturing out. Silver Division was won by Ladies' Captain Joy Bowler (14) with 13 points, 2 points ahead of Lucy Hindmarsh (12) and Betsy Haldon (19). Rebecca Booth (25) won Bronze Division with the day's best score of 16 points. Alison Kitson (26) came second with 13 points, a point ahead of Linda Booth (28) in third.
