Competition Savvy

Competition season proper is with us again, and it is worth pointing out some do's and don'ts which help keep things running smoothly. You will have seen on TV how what might seem like trifling little infringements end up in penalties and disqualification for the world's best players. We all play to the same rules – and even local rules – so best not to get caught out. You will find the Seascale Rules for Competitions on the notice board and on the website (members area Club/Rules and Constitution/Rules for Competitions) – competitors should familiarise themselves with these. It is worth emphasising too that a lot of the rules and guidance involve the etiquette of the game which we all have to learn – it doesn't just come naturally. Above

all else it is your own integrity that counts – if you make a mistake – don't hide it – own up and show that you have penalised yourself.

Please Don't...

Forget to tell your playing partner(s) and the Club if you withdraw from a booked tee time.

Leave your partners high and dry – by attempting to move to another tee time.

Change your booked tee time – stick to it unless you are clearly helping others get their game.

Please Do...

Ensure your card is signed by player and marker. Penalty disqualification.

Record on the card the correct gross score at each hole. Penalty disqualification.

Ensure your correct handicap is recorded on the card. Penalty disqualification.

Put the card in the competition box. Penalty disqualification.

Enter your individual score via the PSI Touchscreen. Penalty - Potential suspension from comps.

Golf Mark & Golf Foundation

Seascale is well on the way to accreditation under the Golf Mark scheme. This demonstrates that the Club has everything in place as far as management, sustainability, safeguarding, and business planning and strategy are concerned. The R&A and Englandgolf are the sponsors of the scheme and a particular focus is on juniors and bringing them on in a safe and secure way. Brampton is the only other Cumbrian club with accreditation currently.

The HSBC sponsored Golf Foundation aims at bringing youngsters into the game and is based on numbers, taster sessions, action plans, good

coaching and supervision. Financial help is available to clubs which are proactive in encouraging participation. Bev New, our dedicated professional coach and Adam have worked hard to secure Seascale's future in these schemes.

Junior News

Seascale Juniors attend coaching twice a month on Saturdays. They also have a junior competition once a month for all standards and ages.

We played a friendly junior match against Cockermouth during the Easter holidays at Cockermouth, all ages and all standards. 10 juniors travelled to Cockermouth on the day and represented Seascale and they all had a great time. This week we held a drive, chip and putt challenge just like they have at the Masters during a junior coaching camp.

We are holding a 2-hour FREE taster day on Easter Monday 22nd April.

In early June we are hosting the tri-golf festival for the junior schools in Copeland, this will be a great opportunity to show the schools what we have to offer at Seascale Golf club, and it promises to be a very busy day.
