

Dear Fellow Member

The seasons seem to be starting later and later and this is very much reflected in the course condition which will improve as soon as we get warmer, drier weather. Thankfully the course has, in the main, stayed open without the need for forced closure due to continuing inclement weather.

The 18<sup>th</sup> fairway is now open so we are now playing on the full course. There is a lot of continuing work on the course and we will keep you updated via BRS notices and the weekly newsletter. A Whole Hole Course Strategy document is now with the Board of Directors to review before communication meetings are arranged with all members for discussion and approval. The agreed Strategy will necessitate formal approval at an EGM.

Phase I of the clubhouse refurbishment work is almost complete – there are some snagging issues which are in progress of being completed. I do hope you all like the new look of the clubhouse, it is certainly more welcoming and inviting.

Phase II cannot be completed as we have insufficient member gift donations to allow us to do this. We are very grateful to the members who made gifted pledges and brought Phase 2 to where it is now with just £18,000 short of completion to the original design. We also want to improve the main entrance for disabled access and to prevent leaves blowing into the entranceway – Phase 3. This will cost £20,000.

Our new clubhouse steward and caterer have now moved into the flat and have made a great effect on the service delivery to members. This is reflected in the number of members and guests attending events and coming into the clubhouse for a drink and food after golf. We also have sky sports showing in the Linton Room, courtesy of a member who has kindly paid for this year's annual subscription.

To arrive at subscription rates for 2023 – 2024 we have looked at anticipated business costs for next year, including capital expenditure. This is, of course, a movable feast as we never know what we will be faced with in terms of repairs; cost of materials and confirmation of membership subscription renewals which are due by the latest date of 10<sup>th</sup> July. We have not increased the subscription by RPI plus 5%, which will no doubt come as a relief to members in light of current escalating costs.

I hope you will agree that your subscription gives value for money and will continue to be a playing member of Wetherby Golf Club.
