### **The County Championships**

The County Championships were played at Ellesborough GC on the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> May 2022. The Final was played between Ella Butteriss (Beaconsfield GC) and Grace Rigby-Walden (Gerrards Cross GC) with Ella winning the Championship. The Intermediate Championship was won by Alice Kozlowksi (Ellesborough GC) who, over the last 8 years has won the Championship on 7 occasions (in 2020 the Competition was cancelled due to Covid). Alice also equaled her own course record on the first round of the qualifying Competition.

### 6 COUNTY CAPTAIN'S REPORT - Janet Beal

It has been great to get back to almost normal this year and I have had a great time watching lots of golf all over the county and beyond.

I have been sending out a monthly newsletter to all subscribed members, so apologies if I am repeating some of the news that I included in in my newsletter.

The day after the AGM last year, I went up to Leamington & County Golf Club for a meeting about County Match Week – a review of 2021 and plans for 2022. We had a similar meeting yesterday at Sonning, which is the venue for the 2023 County Match Week.

Over the winter of 2021/22 we arranged training sessions for the second team and seniors teams. In the past, our training has been mainly aimed at the first team, but this winter we decided to change the focus. I was able to go along to watch a couple of the training sessions, and everyone seemed to enjoy the days.

The first main county event of 2022 was the County Lunch, to be held at Beaconsfield. The 2021 lunch was cancelled, so I was really looking forward to the day. Imagine my disappointment when I tested positive for Covid the day before the lunch, so was unable to attend. Thanks to the rest of the exec, Helen Mines and the team at Beaconsfield, who all rallied round and made it a very successful day.

Thank you to everyone who attended the lunch and to all the ladies sections and clubs that donated 4 ball vouchers and raffle prizes. We raised just under £2½k for my charity at the lunch.

In early 2022, we also started planning for our centenary in 2023, and thanks to everyone who has contributed information and photographs. I will let Susanna tell you more about what she has planned for our Centenary.

We resumed our face to face Delegates Meetings in autumn 2021, with Tony's coaching sessions before the meetings. I hope everyone who came along enjoyed the sessions. I have also followed on from Gail and tried to make the meetings more interactive and have discussed various topics of interest.

The Club Delegate role is very important – they are the main conduit of information between county and club members and also to share best practice between clubs. If you have some ideas how we as county could improve what we offer to YOU, then please either go through your delegate, or just email directly to one of the county executive.

Now a few of the golfing highlights from this year:

I was lucky enough to be at The Berkshire for the London Ladies Foursomes and watch the Denham pair of Gemma Bradbury and Niamh O'Connor win the event.

I played in the Seniors Spring Meeting at Buckingham. A very enjoyable day, but rather poorly supported with only 8 teams playing.

A special mention to Delyth and her junior committee – they do some great work running competitions and encouraging our junior girls. This year they have run monthly par 3 competitions for the pre handicap girls – fun competitions where everyone seems to win a small prize. We have a whole range of junior girls, from those just starting off to three of our girls who have played international golf for their countries this year.

I went along to watch a number of junior events this year including pre handicap events, the spring meeting that was won with 52 points, and two junior scratch matches - one at Henley in pouring rain and one at Harleyford in over 30 degrees of heat and parched fairways – a normal British summer!

The County Championship at Ellesborough was fantastic. Ellesborough looked after us very well. The final was very exciting, a very close match until Ella birdied 5 holes in a row from the  $11^{\rm th}$  to take the championship. Just over 3 weeks later, Ella won the ladies club championships at Beaconsfield with a 36 hole score of 12 under par, so she was obviously in a rich vein of form.

I also played in the inaugural par 3 competition at Wycombe Heights – a good challenge for those of us who don't hit the ball very far and great fun for all.

The main event in June is regional County Match Week. We chose a team of 9, only to have Ciara Egan withdraw on the day before the matches started when she tested positive for Covid.

It was too late to find a reserve, so we had to go with a team of 8. There is a full report and lots of photos on the web site, but it was a fantastic few days and I can only thank my team for all their support and the fantastic team spirit that they showed.

All the girls played great golf and we won all our matches. I even had the luxury of knowing on the last day that we couldn't be caught for the regional title. I was also delighted to announce at the end of CMW that Ella, Grace and Hannah were awarded their county colours.

The next event was my summer meeting at Beaconsfield. Thanks to everyone who helped – the ladies who baked cakes and manned the halfway huts, my husband who supplied Pimms to all the players and the greens staff and catering staff at Beaconsfield who gave us a superb course and excellent food on the day.

We then had the senior and junior county championships, both at Harleyford. Congratulations to Katie Reid, our incoming second team captain, who retained her seniors title and to Ella Butteriss who broke the ladies course record in winning the junior title.

My final major event was National Finals – where all the regional county match week winners play for the national title. Again there is a full report and photos on the web site.

As usual in September, a few of the girls were back at university in the USA, but we still had a very strong team and were confident that we had a good chance for our best ever result.

We lost our first match, but then won the next 3 matches and on the last day there was a chance that we could win the title. It was not to be, as Essex held on to win all 5 matches and take the title, but we won 4 out of 5 matches and came a clear second, which is by far our best ever result.

All of the girls played great golf. I have been very lucky to inherit an excellent team. I can only thank all of those people before me who had the foresight to concentrate on developing our county juniors as all of the current team have come through the county junior ranks.

National Finals was a farewell to two of our girls who are moving on to professional ranks:

Thalia Kirby has played for county since 2014 and has won 44½ points in first team matches. Thalia has already turned pro and is about to travel to Spain to play in some events before going to qualifying for the Ladies European Tour. Megan Dennis has played for county since 2013 and has won 37½ points in first team matches. Megan is also planning to turn pro and go to qualifying school. We wish them both the best in their future careers.

Finally I would just like to mention a few other golfing achievements this year:

- Roisin Scanlon from Woburn won the Scottish Girls U16 title and was selected for Ireland Girls in several international events
- Robert and Elizabeth Culley from Ivinghoe won the R&A 9 hole challenge
- Rosie Bee Kim from The Buckinghamshire won the English Girls U16 title and was selected for the GB&I Junior Vagliano team and for England Girls in several international events
- Olivia Lee from Gerrards Cross played for both England Girls and England Women in several international events
- Roisin Scanlon and Ella Butteriss have both won through to the Daily Telegraph Junior Finals at Quinta Do Lago which starts on 31st October

### 7 TREASURER'S REPORT AND ADOPTION OF THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE PERIOD 1ST AUGUST 2021 TO 31ST JULY 2022 - Carolyn Rivett

With the improved outlook post Covid we have managed to deliver a healthy surplus of £5,908 in the main accounts compared to £2,742 last year. The Juniors' section showed a deficit of £114 compared to a previous year surplus of £60, which is good progress from pre Covid years.

### **Main Accounts**

**Income** was up from £38,289 in 2019 (pre Covid) to £46,436.46. I am comparing to the 2019 figures as this is a better comparison than to last year which was severely affected by Covid.

### **Affiliation Fees**

Affiliation fees have increased 27% on last year and 25% on 2020 which is partly due to the increase in the fee of 23%, and partly down to an increase in affiliated members. However, current returns from some clubs are showing a decrease in numbers of Ladies, so the increase in members may not last in all cases.

### **Charity Income**

Because we have made a healthy surplus this year, we feel that we are in the position to donate all of the £3,723 raised to charity this year, rather than retaining 50% in line with our budget. This compensates for the lack of charity money raised last year and is planned to be a one-off.

### **Competition Income**

This is our first year of post Covid competition entries and we have found entries to be down in some competitions, possibly due to everyone catching up with other plans. Of the £3,545 brought forward from the Covid period for competition entries we still have £880 which has not been re-used or refunded.

**Expenditure** was reduced from £57,740 (2019) to £40,529. Costs were generally in line with budget with overspends in some areas compensated for by underspends in others. Budgeted spend for 2021/22 was £44,400 compared to the actual of £40,529. Significant savings were made by having some of the Exec Team meetings on Zoom rather than all meeting in person, although there is felt to be a need to meet face to face for some of the meetings. National Finals and County Match Week both came in under budget, although the costs for the 2022 National Finals in Southampton which is in next years' accounts, were over budget. This primarily depends on the location and availability of accommodation.

### **Junior Accounts**

**Income** was £6,425 which is in line with figures before Covid. Of this £2,653 related to competition costs and £1,453 related to Academy and coaching income with the balance being made up of the England Golf grant and the Cygnet Trophy. £330 of Cygnet Trophy income received at the end of the year was carried forward to next year, as this income is normally shown at the start of each year.

An additional note on the accounts: There is £180 entry fee left in refunds for competitions not played due to Covid in 2020. If anyone is due a refund then please contact Carolyn before the 31 October 2022.

If there are any questions on the accounts, I would be happy to take these at the AGM.

The accounts presented to the end of July 2022 have been approved by our Honorary Auditor, Mr S Godfrey of Godfrey Anderson & Co. No issues were raised following the review.

This year end report is also my last report as 2nd Team captain for the last 3 years. Of course.

the first year was somewhat intercepted by Covid as was everything in our lives.

There were some worries in our 2nd Team Match vs Oxfordshire at Burnham Beeches Golf Club on 30th May 2022......it was so cold would we be able to properly grip the club! Well the Bucks 2nd Team are a hardy lot and brought home a victory of 5 matches to 4 against very tough opponents and tough weather: cold and very wet at times.

It was a great weather day for 2nd Team Match vs Berkshire at Castle Royle Golf Club on 19th June 2022.....an interesting way to spend Father's Day! Thanks to the Dads who gave up their daughters to golf for day, and especially the parents, Stewart, Brenda and Jane who were there all day supporting their girls!

Nevertheless, we won 3 % matches with every one a nail biting finish. The usual high standard of play also by our 2nd Team but in the morning Foursomes, the Bucks 2nd Team were outplayed by Berkshire who won all three matches. Congratulations to Berkshire for their 5 % to 3 % victory.

We entered the 2<sup>nd</sup> Team Final at Badgemore Park, in August, to play for 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Course conditions and weather very hot. Despite a valiant effort, we we not successful and finished in 4<sup>th</sup> place. All to play for in 2023!

In 2022 the 2nd team Captains also agreed to update the rules for matches and finals; these can be found on the BCLGA website. We have also introduced the award of county 2nd Team Colours where players that win 6 matches for the county are awarded a badge to recognise their extraordinary contribution.

Playing for the 2nd team gives girls and women of all ages, with a handicap index of 10 or lower, an opportunity to represent Buckinghamshire in matches against other counties. It is a good way to play competitive golf at a high standard and have some fun some of the county's best players too!

Now I will be handing over to a new  $2^{nd}$  Team Captain, subject to confirmation at the AGM after two years of the enjoyment with some great players in tough competitions. Thank you for your support and good luck to the  $2^{nd}$  Team in the years to come.

### **COUNTY JUNIOR ORGANISER REPORT - Delyth Barnett**

What a year this has been! The junior section continues to go from strength to strength and we have seen a new course record set and a hole in one, but more about that later.

A number of the girls have been playing in national competitions throughout the summer, with many of them making the cut in their respective competition.

Rosie Bee Kim and Olivia Lee were both selected for the England Girls team and we are again fortunate that we have a number of girls who have been invited to join England Thames Valley region training squad.

The junior captain for 2022 was Georgia Lloyd and we are very grateful to Georgia for all her support this year and wish her all the very best at University.

### **Junior Funding**

It is worth mentioning how the junior section is funded. We get a grant from England Golf which enables us to subsidise the training and charge a lessor amount. We also charge entry fees for the competitions. The rest of our funds come from the cygnet trophy competition which many of the clubs in Bucks enter and I would like to thank the county ladies who have entered over the years for their very valuable support. This money makes a huge difference.

### **Matches**

Every year we play in the Midland South junior team events. The region is divided into two divisions and we play our matches against Berkshire and Oxfordshire with the winner going through to regional finals.

Due to the number of low handicaps in the junior section it is not always possible to field a full team for the girls handicap competitions (handicaps 16-36). We were fortunate to have some girls quite new to golf prepared to play and they played extremely well but were sadly beaten by Oxfordshire and Berkshire.

The junior girls scratch team played well and we beat Oxfordshire but lost against Berkshire and therefore did not make the finals this year

### **Midland South Teams Championships**

This is held annually and this year it was the turn of Warwickshire to host and all six counties in the Midland South entered teams. The format is a stableford competition which each county having a team of 6 players, 2 from handicaps 0-12, two from 12-20 and 2 from 20 and over.

Our team was made up of Georgia Lloyd (Junior Captain), Claudia Weston, Lena West, Amelie Jones, Ajuni Bains and Kacey Maxey.

The girls played really well, and I am pleased to announce that we won.

### **BCLGA** competitions

We continue to run a Par 3 championship, Spring, Summer and Autumn meetings. Our county championship was held at Harleyford Golf Club and the 2022 champion is Ella Butteriss with a 69, which set a new course record.

Our thanks to Whiteleaf, Wycombe Heights and Buckingham Golf Clubs for hosting us this year,

### **Karchargis competition**

This is a lady / junior foursomes competition which we hold at the end of the summer holidays at Oakland Park. This is always a great fun day out and it would be great if you could encourage the junior girls at your club to play and play with them.

This year's competition will be memorable for Amelie Jones's (Harewood Downs) hole in one.

### **Training**

### **Training with Tony Bowers (County Coach)**

Each year we run three or four training sessions with Tony Bowers. These are a mixture of skills practice, on the course and rules and are always great fun. We have been very fortunate that we have been able to run these sessions at Oakland Park and thank the members and the staff at Oakland for this.

### **Academy training**

We have continued to run the academy training programme. This has historically been run at Abbey Hill and Wycombe Heights but after more than ten years of fantastic coaching, Noel Rousseau was unable to continue with it at Wycombe Heights We thank Noel for all that he has done over those years and Martin Heys at Wexham Park stepped in to provide the coaching for the south of the county and these sessions are going really well.

Kevin Jones continues to run the coaching at Abbey Hill and we are very grateful to him for his support.

### **Funding from England Golf**

Each year we apply for funding from England Golf (roughly £1,400) to help with training costs and you may recall that last year we were rolling out a new Pathway. This has been updated for 2023 and is included with this report. See Appendix B.

### Pre handicap and higher handicap Par 3 Fun Days

We relaunched these in July 2021 and we have continued to run these during 2022, albeit numbers have started to drop towards the end of this year. This is only to be expected as some of the girls have got their handicaps and are now playing in the other junior competitions.

We meet the first of the month at either Abbey Hill, Wycombe Heights or Wexham Park and we are very grateful to these clubs for hosting us.

The fun days allow the girls to practice what they are learning at their own club and start to meet up with other girls in the county. It is a very gentle introduction to the world of county golf and is for any girl of any age who has had a few lessons and is ready to play a par 3 or short course.

There are three levels, bronze, silver and gold and at entry level and no girl is left to struggle.

It would be good to have some more ladies helping with this event, so please let me know if you have a couple of hours to spare.

### A huge thank you ......

As you all know the Bucks ladies Golf Association is run by a team of volunteers and I would like to thank the junior committee for all their hard work in ensuring that this year has been such a success. My thanks to Brenda Byrne (Gerrards Cross), Cecilia Williams (Huntswood) and Wendy Egan (Woburn).

I must also thank Lynda Hilton our president and Janet Beal for all their support in supporting the various competitions and matches.

It is also important at this stage to record how grateful the junior section is to Janet Beal for all the hard work and support she has given us, first as junior competition secretary, then County Junior Organiser and more recently County captain. Janet has been part of the junior section for around 10 years and she will be missed.

### And so to 2023

We will be working on the programme during the winter and it would be great to see as many girls as possible taking part in our events next year. As a county, it is easy to field a

"scratch" junior team but harder to field a "handicap " one with girls with handicap indexes over 14. We generally have one or two seasons at the most between girls getting their handicaps to dropping below 14 so it is vitally important that we continue to support those girls starting out in golf to get their handicaps and join in. Please continue to encourage your girls to take part.

### **SENIORS' CAPTAIN REPORT - Lois Shoosmith**

League Matches: I enjoyed watching these matches, unfortunately Bucks results do not reflect how close the individual matches were. We welcomed 2 new players to the team and look forward to welcoming more next year. Bucks finished 5<sup>th</sup>. I am delighted that Lynn Fitzpatrick earned her County Senior's Colours this season. Friendly Matches: These were played in good spirit with a visit to Mill Hill Golf Club an oasis in north London where we lost 1 ½ to 2 ½ to Middlesex. Against Bedfordshire at Buckingham Golf Club we managed to half the match.

The very hot summer certainly provided some challenging conditions.

The Seniors' Championships: these were held at Harleyford Golf Club. Katie Reid won the scratch again and Sue Cooke won the net prize.

The Spring Meeting had a small turn out, the day was enjoyed by those who played, the wining senior team and overall winners were Val Smith Lindsay Parker and Tracey Mann (Woburn), and the Vets Trophy was won by Diane Hofman, Pam Rowett and Jeanette Richardson (Buckingham).

The Autumn Meeting was well attended with our first visit for many years to South Bucks Golf Centre formally Farnham Park Golf Course. The day was well supported with 14 teams. Those who played the course enjoyed the challenge. The senior winners were Pauline Gillard, Sandra Spencer, and Julie Pearson, (Oakland Park and Burnham Beeches), and the Vets winners were Bernie Howe, Fiona Robb and Carol Mitchell (Buckingham).

Next year it is planned to return to Buckingham in the Spring and South Bucks Golf Centre in the Autumn.

Bucks hosted the Midland South Seniors Championship at Burnham Beeches Golf Club. The weather was a changeable, the heat wave had not started. This was very well supported with 18 clubs across 5 counties represented. The stroke play competition was won by Tracy Crew from Reading Golf Club.

Inter-county Team Championships: this was cancelled due to the Queen's Funeral.

Training: during the winter 2 training days were held with the members from all the teams. We hope to repeat these days again this winter.

I would like to thank all the seniors for their support and encouragement through the year. I have really enjoyed watching excellent golf and made new friends.

### **ENGLAND GOLF VOTING MEMBER REPORT - Susanna Mitterer Equality, Diversity & Inclusion:**

EDI steering group and operational group meetings continue to be held. The England Golf EDI strategic framework 2022-2025 has been published, which links closely to their Sport England submission on tackling inequalities. Over the course of the next year both counties and clubs will received support with focusing their practices on greater equality, diversity and inclusion. Very much like SafeGolf accreditation, both clubs and counties will need to adopt and implement an EDI Policy and action plan during 2023. Audit tools and action plans and other support documents will be made available from EG. The Club Support officers are focusing to support clubs in making inclusive changes to their operations, relating mainly to course and competition access, staff recruitment and integrating juniors.

### **Participation:**

Another successful Women & Girls Week (1 to 7 August) was delivered with excellent engagement across many stakeholders. The EG Junior Golf Strategy in collaboration with the Golf Foundation (aligned to the Course Planner) is being implemented. Girls Golf Rocks (GGR) has 200 golf clubs involved in the 2022 edition, and 140 clubs have utilised Women on Par resources. Women in Golf Charter clubs has reached 500 (sadly only 2 so far in Buckinghamshire). More learning & development opportunities for counties and clubs continue to be delivered virtually in 2022, building on the success of last year. Get into golf resources have been refreshed for 2022 and made available to all golf clubs online.

### World Handicap System (WHS):

To date, 499K golfers have downloaded the My England Golf App and 270K golfers have opted in to receive communications. 13.9million scores have been inputted into the WHS in England since April 2021 (5.9million in 2022), with 1.8million scores submitted through our App. Phase one (handicap lookup) and phase 2 (score returns) of interoperability with Scotland is live. The R&A/USGA continue to explore interoperability across all worldwide licensed federations. The R&A/USGA have issued an update to the Playing Conditions Calculation (PCC) algorithm which is now live with our system. A national Course Rating training programme will be rolled out from autumn across all counties. Handicap committee training will also be delivered to counties this autumn (2 face to face sessions), for counties then to deliver content/education to affiliated clubs.

### iGolf:

The EG target of 25K iGolf subscribers was reached in first year of trading, with the total number of subscribers now at 32,000 since launch. The average handicap is 19.6, the average age is 42 years. 187K scores have been submitted to date. The microsite (www.englandigolf.org), WHS platform and MyEG App are working well for iGolf subscribers. Communications and marketing are being reviewed on a weekly basis to assess impact and ROI. A female specific marketing campaign is now being implemented as only 4% of subscribers are female. Golf club specific offers for iGolfers are being promoted via the website, with about 60 clubs now offering competitions to iGolf members. A staggering 2, 00 iGolf members have already transferred into Club membership thus providing £1.5m of additional income to golf clubs.

The surplus income generated by iGolf for England Golf for ca £200,000 will be distributed out to counties in April 2023. At that stage counties can decide on how to allocate this additional funding.

### **Affiliation Fees:**

There will be no increase of affiliation fees in 2023 but an inflationary adjustment is likely to occur in 2024.

### **National Golf Centre (NGC):**

The England Golf Board proposed a transformational investment of £10m into the National Golf Centre at Woodhall Spa Golf Club in early 2022, building upon the visionary investment originally made in 1995.

At the April 2022 General Meeting, England Golf stakeholders/members unanimously expressed the view, that the Home of England Golf and the National Golf Centre would remain at Woodhall Spa for the foreseeable future.

It was also agreed that a "next generational" investment is required to appropriately update and revitalise the National Golf Centre, inclusive of a new clubhouse, out-buildings and surrounding areas, that through time have become unfit for purpose.

The England Golf "Course Planner" (strategic plan), states to uphold and prioritise guiding principles, values and to act with fortitude delivering on core responsibilities and duties. (Inclusive of: Equality & Equity, Inclusivity & Accessibility, Strong Governance and investment into our National Golf Centre).

However, when the Ladies Associations merged with EG in 2012 the ladies became shareholders and members of EG but NOT shareholders of the Woodhall Spa Estate Management / Land Holding company that holds the freehold of the property and land. Currently only the Men's Unions and Merged counties are shareholders of the Freehold property.

The England Golf Board have made it clear that they are not prepared to lead on a significant investment into a property where the ownership does not reflect the membership of England Golf. To do so would favour some elements of their membership over others. To that extent the redevelopment of the Woodhall Spa clubhouse is inextricably linked to the reform of WSLH membership.

A broader, more inclusive control of the freehold site is essential for a modern governing body to maintain the highest standards of corporate governance. As was noted during the merger in 2012, the image of golf remains that it is, to some extent, an exclusive and divided game. This should not be the case in 2022 and it cannot continue.

At the General Meeting held in Sept 2022 the Chairman asked for a show of hands on addressing the issue and the vast majority of counties indicated a clear commitment to addressing this imbalance in ownership of the freehold property. Only 6 counties objected.

A further vote was held on the make – up of the WSLH Board going forward. 53% of votes (55% on poll vote) were for incorporating a 'hybrid' board, with nine members from the England Golf/Woodhall Spa Golf Management boards, alongside an invited three members from the previous estate holding board, ensuring interests are represented and important expertise retained.

A further vote was held to decide on the proposed £10m investment plan into a building a new clubhouse (phase 1) and new accommodation blocks (phase 2), as part of a next generational investment into our National Golf Centre. Again the motion to invest was carried with 59% (63% on poll vote).

### **HANDICAP ADVISOR REPORT - Karen Scott**

Thankfully we have all had a busier and more 'normal' year of golf. WHS is now well bedded in and running smoothly in most golf clubs.

I have offered support and advice to clubs and handicap secretaries from a range of clubs during the year. Some clubs have sought advice when there has been a change of officers who are running competitions and handicaps in their clubs. We all need to continue the conversations with each other as further developments and improvements are made by England Golf.

It is very useful to encourage members to stay in touch with their WHS handicap record by using the myEG app. Players can see all their previous rounds, the last 20 sit above a green line, the best 8 have a green dot – the score differences for these are averaged to calculate the latest handicap index.

Please encourage members in your club to regularly enter qualifying competitions or enter general play rounds so that their handicap index reflects their current playing ability – remember a valid handicap index can range from a + number to 54. Please ensure that members are included and encouraged in a range of competitions in your club.

Clubs may want to look at the terms of entry to their competitions, such as a minimum number of qualifying rounds played in the last 12 months to encourage members to enter scores regularly.

If your club would like support please contact me, we can talk or I can visit.

### **COUNTY COACH REPORT - Tony Bowers**

It has been a very strange golfing year and difficult in respect of arranging training sessions with the 1st team squad as we have several girls now attending TVR and England training schedules but I am very happy to report that the year ended fantastically with a 2nd place finish in the National counties championship at Stoneham GC in September (Our best ever finish).

The Intermediate training sessions at Oakland Park have been very well attended and there are some signs of some very capable youngsters coming through ready to replace some of the girls we have lost this year to American Colleges and also to a couple turning Professional. We have 1 session left in October.

On the 2nd Team and Senior front we held a couple of training sessions at The Oxfordshire and also Harleyford and these were very popular and well attended and it gave me a chance to help and see where there could be some openings for Matchplay experience for some of the younger girls with the 2nd Team. I think this is something we will look to encourage more for the future.

On the 1st team front we once again were victorious at CMW at Northampton GC The team were in tremendous form and once again were unbeaten winning the event 5-0.

We moved onto the Nationals Finals and as earlier mentioned we had our best ever finish a remarkable achievement up against the strongest county golfers from all CMW winners. After a first morning loss to the eventual winners Essex the team rallied brilliantly and their golf was nothing short of spectacular and I could not have been more proud.

Unfortunately we have now lost 2 of our most talented and high points scoring players to the Professional ranks in Thalia Kirby and Megan Dennis but I wish them all the best for the future and will be monitoring their progress intently. I thank them for the years they have given to the county in a very enthusiastic way.

### 16 CLOSING ADDRESS by Susanna Mitterer

Good Afternoon Ladies

I don't quite know how I ended up standing here before you as your County Captain, but it looks like it has actually happened. Janet can be very, very persuasive and after I had said 'no' a couple of times, she must have finally gotten to me on one of my weak days to get me to say yes this past February. It's been a very short term as your Vice-Captain but I have learned a great deal about all the hard work that goes into this being successful in this position. And successful you have certainly been Janet! I've certainly got very big shoes to fill going forward and my tiny size 3 feet might not do!

It was therefore very reassuring to learn that you have decided to continue to support us going forward as County Rules Advisor and in your capacity as a Referee. Janet this county owes you a huge debt of gratitude and we are all very relieved that your knowledge and expertise will remain accessible to us.

I very much enjoyed serving as your Vice Captain and I think I might knocking on your door for advice and input on very many topics – so please don't travel too far afield over the next months!

The past few months have served to indicate to me how hard it is to actually stand on the other side of the ropes, or in my case, being on the bag, during County Match week, The National Finals and other main golfing events of the year. Up until this point my main experience was as a golfer, with my first exposure to County Golf coming in 2010 when I was invited to join the County Second team. I was very honoured to be asked by Sue Lee to join the First team in 2012 when we went on to win the Regional County Match week at Mentmore for the very first time. A feat we have repeated in all but 1 year since – so no pressure there for me to continue this awesome trend!

I was extremely privileged to represent Bucks County at 3 County National Finals, but finally retired from county first team golf in 2019 having earned my county colours. My focus over the past few years has been more firmly on County Seniors golf and I enjoy playing our League & Friendly Matches and the occasional England Golf Seniors Events, as well as being your Senior County Captain and Seniors Competition Organiser.

But playing the game might well take a step back over the coming 2 years as we have a very full and in parts challenging agenda going forward. First and foremost my mind is on the preparations for a schedule of events and competitions to help us celebrate our Centenary year in 2023. I am very honoured and just a little bit intimidated by the fact that I will be our captain through our Centenary Year and I am very grateful to both the exec and other volunteers who have kindly come forward to work in our Centenary Committee and I truly hope you will enjoy what we have in store for you all.

Our Centenary Events include the return of our Golf Gala Day on 14 July at Harleyford and a new competition, the Centenary Trophy on 9 August at Woburn. This will be held in a 4BB format and details of how to enter will be available from our website shortly. Our Centenary Summer Meeting will be held at Oakland Park on 28 July, Lynda - our President's - home club. We are also hosting the Ladies London Foursomes at Burnham Beeches from 24-26 March 2023.

Attracting more Women & Girls into Golf will be a key focus for the county going forward – sadly despite all our concerted efforts we are not moving the needle in terms of female club membership across the county. The same is true across our Nation – whilst golf membership in England has increased over the past 2 years, the percentage of women playing sadly has not. In our County Ladies membership has declined steadily from 2016 onwards – down about 230 members or 9 % accumulated. We certainly need to work with you, our delegates and club representatives to learn to understand and to explore barriers to Women joining clubs or playing on a regular basis.

As a County we have therefore formally registered to achieve Women in Golf Charter status over the next few months and have already drafted a set of commitments and action plans for ratification at our next Executive Meeting. With this in mind we are currently looking to recruit a Charter Champion (male or female) who will support and monitor our commitments and also act as the main point of contact to help and support you to achieve the Women in Golf Charter at club level. We have created a role description for the Charter Champion which will be available from our website and if you are interested please do come forward, or if you know of someone who would be brilliant in this role, please do let us know.

Linked to this initiative is also a drive for greater Equality, Diversity and Inclusion: You just need to look at this room to understand that we still have a very long way to go to make our sport reflective of our society at large and to entice more women from other social and racial backgrounds into golf membership. Sadly only 15% of golfers in our County are female, although this is 1%age point above the National average. More worrying is the fact that the average age of our individual members is 64.8. So clearly we have a long way to go to make golf more attractive to women of all ages, colour and creed.

In line with England Golf's strategy we do need to introduce practices on greater Equality, Diversity and Inclusion —and with this in mind we will strive to create a more diverse set of competitions and events and we are planning to work in partnership with you and your club delegates to see how we can implement this EDI strategy not just at county level but also embed it in your golf clubs. Very much like the Safegolf accreditation, both clubs and counties will need to adopt and implement an EDI Policy and action plan during 2023. Audit tools, action plans and other support documents will be made available from EG. The Club Support officers are focusing on assisting clubs in making inclusive changes to their operations, relating mainly to course and competition access, staff recruitment and integrating juniors.

There will be a couple of more challenging topics for consideration in the coming years — notably a proposed alignment or total re-organisation of the Women's and Men's Regional structure and as a result a potential complete change to the format and schedule of County Match Week and the National Finals. We are also looking forward to introducing a National Seniors competition along the lines of CMW, more details to come as they emerge.

We have received a formal proposal from the BB&O to consider merging with the Men's Union. Having consulted with the other two Ladies Associations in Oxon and Berkshire, and listened to counties who have recently merged or abandoned their intention to merge, we have also decided to move very slowly and cautiously. The main sticking point is the singular focus of the BB&O on 'elite' golf whilst our remit and objectives are set much wider to serve all our members interests. Having said all that we do however, need to explore collaboration opportunities with Ladies Associations and Men's Unions to ensure we build the best and most inclusive structure to foster Girls & Women's Golf development in our county and across the Nation. We owe it to our talented girls, women and seniors to give them an equal level of development, competitive and coaching opportunities going forward.

On a less 'serious' note I would also like to promote our main social event for the coming year – the County Centenary Lunch at Woburn Golf Club on 8<sup>th</sup> of March 2023. I very much look forward to seeing many of you there and I hope that given its excellent reputation and accessibility that we will have a full house come March. This will be the main fundraising event for the year for my chosen charity which is 'Dogs For Good'.

Dogs for Good make life changing differences for people with disabilities. They work to support people and communities through the help of a trained dog, improving and enriching the lives of both. Their assistance dogs support adults and children with a range of disabilities and children with autism. They train activity and therapy dogs to work with specialist handlers to support adults with autism, learning disabilities, dementia and other individual needs in a wide range of community settings. The Family Dog Service gives specialist advice and support to help families with a child with autism get the most out of their relationship with their pet dog.

I was first exposed to Dogs for Good when my neighbour Linda Grist signed up to be one of their dog socialisers 6 years ago. For the first 12-16 months puppies are place with a socialiser - where they learn their basis skills in a safe home environment before they go on to 'formal training'. I instantly fell in love with her first puppy 'Tom' and soon thereafter signed up and qualified to be one of their dog boarders. Linda has since socialised 6 puppies and together with your help it is my ambition that we 'sponsor' our very own Buckinghamshire dog over the next 2 years. He or she hasn't been born yet – but when the puppy arrives early next year we will be able to name it – and we have chosen to call her/him 'Caddie'. Throughout the next 2 years we will hopefully see Caddie and some of their other dogs at many of our events before these young dogs go on to 'big school' and hopefully graduate to finally being paired with their disabled partner for life. I hope you will join me in supporting this very worthy charity and with any luck many of you will get to meet Caddie and their other dogs over the course of the next two years.

Susanna thanked all the ladies for attending the AGM this year and looked forward to seeing everyone next year. Have a safe journey home.


