

## MAINTAINING A HANDICAP INDEX AT HUNTSWOOD

### General Play (was Supplementary Score/ Casual Score)

#### Maintaining A Handicap Index – General Play

The most accurate and optimal Handicap Index is one comprised of 20 scores.

The Handicap Index is the average of the best 8 scores in the last 20 scores.

Once there are 20 scores in the player record the Handicap Index is maintained by adding competition play or casual scores and continues as the average of the best 8 scores in the last 20 scores.

After allocation of an Initial Handicap Index (submitting cards for 54 holes), a player can continue to add competition and general play scores to their record.

The handicap index becomes more accurate the more scores are added.

Players are encouraged to submit general play scorecards when they play 18 holes under competition conditions.

#### How to Complete a General Play Card

General play has been developed to give players more options for maintaining a current handicap index as well as qualifying competition play.

- You must first declare your intention to submit a “General Play” card by signing into the general play score using the PSI terminal in the clubhouse or the HDID app. ***If you do not sign in prior to your round, the card will not be accepted for handicapping.***
- You should play a round of 18 holes under competition conditions and your card must be marked by a member.
- On completion of your round please carefully check your card and ensure the marker signs and prints their name and you must also sign the card.
- Enter your score in the PSI terminal or HDID app and place your card in the competitions box.
