

April update no2

With the current challenging environment both virus and climatically our team of green staff under Ian Georges' supervision continue to look after our 3 courses and 45 greens!! Yes 45 greens. The current dry conditions are proving a challenge with a daily watering regime in place to cover greens and tees on all the courses.

Cutting heights are as follows:-

Greens 5mm

Tees 12mm

Fairways 18mm

Rough 38-40mm

The greens have now received also this week another 60 tons of sand and are being vertidrained to aid rooting and water penetration. The fringes to the greens are being vertidrained too. Divoting has been completed on all courses and an on-going daily battle is occurring repairing overnight badger damage.

With no significant rainfall expected until early may the above cutting and watering regime will be maintained. Ian George has asked if anyone with carpentry skills would like to put their skills to building bird boxes or boxes or dormouse boxes he would be most appreciative.

Stay safe and that game of golf gets a day nearer each day!!!
