# SCARBOROUGH SOUTH CLIFF GOLF CLUB – LADIES SECTION

# **COMPETITION GUIDELINES**

This manual outlines guidance and rules for the running of Competitions and Handicaps at Scarborough South Cliff Golf Club and it is subordinate to the Rules of Golf as published by the R&A and to the World Handicap System as laid down by England Golf and Congu.

The Handicap Committee and Chairman of Golf shall be responsible for enforcing the rules laid down. Any appeals against their decisions must be made in writing within seven days and will be heard by the Handicap Committee in the first instance. The England Golf Rules of Appeal are available online or displayed at the Club.

#### TO GAIN A HANDICAP

A member obtains a Handicap index by posting score cards totalling 54 holes (3 x 18, 6 x 9 or a combination of both) marked by another member and posted in the competitions box on the day of play. Evidence of a reasonable standard of golf is expected prior to being given a Handicap Index. When a card is being marked for handicap assessment, play must be in 2s only.

#### **COMPETITIONS**

The Club competitions entry limits are shown as Handicap Indexes:

<u>Handicap Index</u> – personal to you and is updated after each qualifying competition. <u>Course Handicap</u> – Your Index shown as shots received when playing from the Red Tees on our Course. A conversion chart is used to convert the Index to Course Handicap.

<u>Playing Handicap</u> – The Course Handicap adjusted by the Allowance for a particular Competition (i.e. Stableford or Medal the Allowance is 95% of Course Handicap). *See Attachment 1*.

In most cases, COURSE HANDICAP and/or PLAYING HANDICAP is used to calculate competition results.

Competitors score cards **MUST INCLUDE** the COURSE INDEX and preferably also the Handicap Index. The Handicap Committee will be responsible for applying the Handicap Allowances where appropriate, to determine the winners of competitions. The Handicap Allowances are set by the World Handicap System (Attachment 1).

#### MEDAL COMPETITIONS

All members with a Handicap Index can play in medal competitions. A player MUST SIGN the Competition Entry Book to register her intention to play. Time Sheets for

Medals are posted up to four weeks in advance. Choose your own partners. (Where there is a single competitor the Committee shall appoint an eligible marker whose appointment may be authorised by the Committee retrospectively).

For Mid-week Medal Competitions, sign the time sheet if you wish to play in the time band. Ladies may go out during the rest of the day and join the competition by having signed the competition entry book, having also entered their starting time in the book. Entry fee due on day of play.

For the weekend Medal competitions there will be no starting sheet or priority on the tee. Players should arrange own partners and tee times should be booked online. Sign the competition entry book before commencing play. There is no entry fee and no prize is awarded. All score cards should be returned including incomplete ones.

#### **STABLEFORDS**

All ladies with a Handicap Index are eligible to play in Stableford Competitions. Time Sheets for Stableford Competitions are posted up to four weeks in advance. Players wishing to play outside the time band should sign in the space provided on the sign-up sheet. Players should sign the entry book and pay the entry fee. All cards must be returned, including incomplete ones.

Ladies unable to participate in the midweek Stableford may play on the designated Alternative Day and should sign up in the space provided at the bottom of the sign-up sheet. Players must sign the competition entry book on the day and pay the entry fee. Players should arrange their own partners and book their tee time on line. All cards must be returned, including incomplete ones.

Players can play in either the weekday competition or the Alternative Day but not both and the scores will be amalgamated with the midweek competition to determine the winners.

# NINE-HOLE QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS

Players intending to play a nine-hole competition within the scheduled tee time should indicate this on the sign-up sheet and sign in the entry book, again indicating their intention to play nine holes. Entry fee, if applicable, to be paid on day of competition. The appropriate scorecard for the nine-hole competition, showing the different stroke index, must be used.

**Buggies** may be used in competitions provided that the Club permits their use.

# MINIMUM NUMBER OF HOLES PLAYED

For a score to be acceptable as a 9-hole score, all holes on the measured 9-hole course must have been played.

For a score to be acceptable as an 18-hole score at least 10 holes of the measured

course in a designated 18-hole competition must have been played. There must be valid reason for playing a reduced number of holes: failing light/bad weather, holes out of play. (WHS 2020)

# **GENERAL PLAY SCORES**

Players can submit General Play Scores using their COURSE HANDICAP. Members must sign the General Play Score book before play. Play is with a Marker and signed cards must be returned to the Competition Box.

The Club operates a Player Score Input system (PSI) and, if this is available at the time of play, each player is responsible for the correct input of her score at the end of each round.

# ELIGIBILITY TO PLAY IN CLUB CUPS AND TROPHY COMPETITIONS

- 1) All competitors must have a bone fida Handicap Index.
- 2) "Qualifying competition" means any 9 or 18 hole competition played over a measured course with full handicap and no restriction of clubs.
- 3) All competitors must sign the Competition Entry Book before they play.
- 4) The maximum Handicap Index for Club Cups and Trophies is shown against each cup and trophy description in the Red Book. Ladies with a handicap index that exceeds the maximum Handicap Index are not eligible to play in Cup Competitions but can play in Medals, Stablefords, Fun Competitions and Club competitions as designated i.e. Queen Elizabeth Stableford and Birch Cup.
- 5) All female Junior Members may compete in monthly Medal and Stablefords providing they have a handicap index of **35.3** or less. In all Senior Medals and Stablefords they must play with a full member. Junior boys and junior girls will be eligible to win silverware once they reach a handicap index of **17.9**. This is in no way aimed at restricting the juniors but about creating fairness across the club as a whole.

Juniors are not eligible to play in what is generally considered to be adult social days such as Captains' Day, Invitation Day, Captains' Drive In, Reciprocal Outings etc unless at the express wish of the Captain at the time. (Committee – May 2016)

#### LADIES CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP AND THE COMMITTEE CUP

Two rounds of 18 hole stroke play, played in August if possible. Play off scratch. There is a handicap index limit of **37.2** to be eligible for the Committee Cup. Both rounds count for handicap purposes, and starting handicap remains same for both rounds and for a play-off.

This is known as a "Fixed Competition" - times set and players put in groups by the Committee and in handicap index order. In the afternoon there will be a time band

for ladies to go out in handicap order (Committee August 2013).

Incorporating separate nett competition, "The Committee Cup" with the same format as gross competition.

In the event of a tie, the winner to be decided by a further round of 18 holes, and if still tied, over last 9-6-3 etc. (Committee January 2007). In the case of Runners Up Ties, these will be decided on the back 18-9-6-3.

Entry fees due on day of play. Prize Money – Club Champion £25 and Committee Cup £20 (Committee – August 2015).

Trolley pullers may be used under the following conditions:

- a) They do not offer any advice to the player.
- b) They do not go onto the green to attend the flag or any other reason. 24 hours notice must be given to a playing partner of the intention to use a trolley puller.

Ride on buggies may be used (Committee August 2012).

#### PRESIDENTS CUP

Three rounds of 18 holes Stroke play. Played on Fridays (A.G.M. 1996)

Aggregate of 2 best scores. Handicap Index limit -37.2 (All three rounds count for handicap purposes) Drawn in two divisions 0 - 23.4 and 23.5 - 37.2

Any round affected by inclement weather would take precedence and be played on the next available Competition Day. (Committee Sept. 2004)

In the case of a tie the winner to be decided by a further round of 18 holes (Committee 1981) and, if still tied, over last 9-6-3 etc.

Runners up (if equal) to be decided on the last 9,6,3,1 holes of the second card and if still equal, the runner-up prize to be divided (Committee 1984). Entry fees due on day of first round.

#### CHALLENGE CUP

1st Division 0 - 23.4, 2nd Division 23.5 - 37.2

Aggregate of two rounds, Tuesday and Friday in any one week in May or June. Ties to be decided over 18 stroke play, if still tied, over last 9-6-3 etc. Both rounds count for handicap purposes. Ladies play off their current handicap index for the Cup and off the same handicap for both rounds and for a play-off, which should be played as soon as possible.

Three medals from the previous twelve months are required in order to qualify for the Challenge Cups (Committee April 2018). Entry fee due on the first round of the competition.

Runners up (if equal) to be decided on the last 9,6,3,1 holes of the 2 cards and if still equal the runner-up prize to be divided (Committee 2013).

#### JUBILEE CUP

18 hole better ball stroke play competition and will be played on one day. Choose own partners. (Amended Committee 2018) Maximum Handicap Index **35.3.** Handicap Allowances will be 85% of COURSE Handicap.

#### ANDERSON LEGACY CUP

18 hole Stroke Play competition. Handicap Index limit 37.2. Drawn in two divisions, 0 - 23.4 and 23.5 - 37.2. Entry fee due on day of play.

#### ANDERSON CUP

A standalone individual Match Play knock-out Competition to be drawn and played between May and September. Handicap index limit **35.3** (Committee j2021) Full difference for handicap in match play. (WHS). If all square at the 18th hole, match will proceed under sudden death principle.

### WILSON BOWL

18 hole Stroke Play, drawn in divisions 0 - 23.4 and 23.5 - 37.2 Handicap Index limit 37.2. In the event of a tie, count back on last 9,6,3,1 etc. Entry fees due on day of play.

Two rounds Tuesday and Friday of same week usually. Stroke Play both rounds. Drawn in Divisions (AGM 1990)

Result of the two cards – eclectic and then 90% of original **playing** handicap deducted. Card must be completed in Round 1 and counts for handicap purposes. Round 2 scores do not count for handicap and therefore may not be entered in the Birch Cup book. Entry fee due on day of first round.

(Handicap bands amended by Committee, January 2021)

One round of 18 holes Stroke Play. Drawn in divisions. In the event of a tie, winner decided on the last 9,6,3,1 etc. Entry fees due on day of play.

PLAXTON ROSE BOWL Handicap Index 0 – 23.4 HELEN WILSON TROPHY Handicap Index 23.5 – 37.2

18 hole stroke play competition which counts for handicap purposes. Entry fee due on day of play. In the event of a tie, winner decided by count back on last 9,6,3,1 etc. (Competitions played on same day decided by Committee 2017)

#### E.I.ATKINSON FOURSOMES SALVER

Foursomes Match Play beginning 1st April. 50% of combined team **course** handicap. Draw for partners of low and high handicaps together. Handicap index limit **35.3** Entry fees to be paid on signing of entry sheet (Committee Jan, 2002) If all square at 18th hole, match will proceed under sudden death principle.

#### **CLARIDGE CUP**

Ladies' competition, age 55 and over (A.G.M. 1991)

18 hole Stroke Play which counts for handicap purposes. Drawn in two divisions 0 - 23.4 and 23.5 - 37.2. In the event of a tie, winner decided by count back on the last 9,6,3,1 etc. Entry fees due on day of play.

# QUEEN ELIZABETH STABLEFORD TROPHY

Played in conjunction with monthly Stablefords from October to September. Best aggregate of 5 scores. Open to all. Entry fees due from 1st October (Committee April 2018)

#### **BIRCH CUP**

18 hole eclectic competition incorporating Medal, Stableford, Club competition and both rounds of the club championship. This does not include Match play, 4BBB or any scores in Scarborough Golf week. Throughout the year all gross scores will be recorded and 50% of course handicap will be deducted. Open to all. Scores to temporary greens and large holes are not allowable. Entry fee due from 1st October (Committee April 2018).

#### WINTER ECLECTIC

Runs from 1st October to 31st March. Entry fee due from 1st October. 15 Consecutive holes to be played, but scores can be used if only 13 holes are played, incorporating Medal, Stableford, Club competitions and 4BBB scores. Can play in threes. Scores to temporary green and large sized holes are allowed. 50% of Course Handicap held at 31st March to be deducted from final total. Divisions **1-23.4**, **23.5-37.2**, **37.3-54** (Committee 2021).

# WINTER LEAGUE

Played from 1st October to 31st March. 15 hole 4BBB Stableford **FULL COURSE** handicap. No handicap limit. Ladies are requested to preserve Fridays for playing the Clutch (Committee April 2018)

Scores on first 13 holes can be counted towards Winter Eclectic. Played even if temporary greens are in use. Play in fours, only with players participating in the same competition, and can only play with the same partner twice. A pair could play with a third lady as marker (Committee January 2008). Before playing an Entry book is to be signed and dated by players and after playing scores be entered even if 15 holes not played. The aggregate of four scores wins. Entry fees due before name goes down or before first game.

#### **CORONATION FOURSOMES**

Staged by the R&A, Stableford Competition as per R&A Rules of Entry -2018 Handicap index limit 36. Entry fees due on day of play.

#### YLCGA FOURSOMES

18 hole Stroke Play qualifying round. Choice of partners. (Maximum combined handicaps 60.4 with an individual limit of 36.4)

#### **CANCER RELIEF**

Format Stableford. Drawn in three divisions **0-23.4**, **23.5** – **37.2** and **37.3 - 54** (Committee 2021). Prize presented at Prize Giving. Scores count for handicap purposes. Entry fees are donations on day of play.

# ENGLAND GOLF FOUNDATION BROOCH

18 Hole Medal Play. Handicap Index set by England Golf. (A donation made to England Golf) Entry fees due day of play.

# ENGLAND GOLF CLUB MEDAL WINNER

The winner will be the player who returns the lowest aggregate of four nett scores in Stroke Play rounds from 1st January to 31st December. (England Golf Jan 2021) (Ties decided on the nett score of the last 9,6,3,1 hole(s) of four cards added together. If still a tie, decision shall be by play-off over 18 holes on current playing handicap index). No handicap index limit.

# MEDAL WINNERS FINAL Committee November 2005)

18 Hole Stroke play competition, counting for handicap, for Medal winners in the year October to September, including weekend Medal competitions. Drawn in handicap index order. No fee. Trophy/prize for winner to keep every year.

# MERIT POINTS (ORDER OF MERIT)

A competition designed to reward the most consistent Golfer over the qualifying events between 1st October to 30th September each year.

#### PRIZE DAYS

**SENIORS' COMPETITION** – Age 70 and over (Committee Sept 2010). Format decided by competitors on the day of play. No entry fee as prizes provided by the Ladies Section.

**FOUR CLUBS** – Open to All. Drawn in one division (Committee April 2018). 15 hole Stableford. Full Course Handicap. Does not count for handicap purposes.

**HIDDEN PARTNERS** – 18 hole Stableford competition. 85% of Course handicap. Two cards combined for Better Ball scores. Does not count for Handicap. (Committee July 2008).

**FLAG COMPETITION** - 18 Hole Stroke Play – Full Course Handicap. Does not count for handicap (Committee Sept 2010). If player has not run out of shots on completion of the 18 holes, they must continue play, commencing at 1st tee.

**AUTUMN MEETING** – Format 4BBB – 85% of Course Handicap (in line with WHS).

**WINTER COMPETITIONS** – Played from October to March. Format dependant on numbers – to be decided by Lady Captain and Committee. In the event of inclement weather, the Lady Captain shall decide at 10.00 a.m. whether the event shall be played (Committee 1992). Drawn in one division and played within time band. Prizes presented immediately after competition.

<u>Notes on Prize Days</u>: All members with handicaps may play in Prize Days. The winners of prizes are requested by the Lady Captain to be present at the prize giving. No change of clothing necessary for the above Prize Days (Committee Sept 2008).

**OPEN DAY** - Format decided by current Ladies Committee.

**YORKSHIRE DAY** - Competitors drawn in threes, High/Medium/Low handicap indexes. Two out of three scores to count. There will be an entry fee and prizes given on the day (Committee July 2013).

**LADIES OUTING** (A.G.M. 1996) ("Fixed Competition") - Competition format to be decided by the Lady Captain and Committee. Numbers playing may be limited by the amount of teeing off time allowed. Entry fee, including cost of transport and meal, due on signing of entry sheets. Teams drawn on arrival — High/Medium/Low.

**INVITATION DAY** (A.G.M. 1996) – Competition format to be decided by Lady Captain and Committee. Members to invite one guest only and the guest must be a member of an Affiliated Golf Club. (Committee Aug. 2004). Entry fee due on signing of entry sheet (Committee Sept. 2000).

**DUCK RUN** – Format decided each year by Lady Captain, who donates the prizes.

**BIRDIES** – Birdies in all qualifying competitions will count for Birdie Tree. (Committee July 2017).

**PAR TROPHY** – Ladies playing in Bronze Division 2 (Index 26.2 to 54) achieving gross pars in 18 hole qualifying competitions will count for the PAR Tree (Committee 2021)

# CAPTAIN'S COMPETITIONS

**LADY CAPTAIN'S DRIVE IN** - Competition the choice of the new Lady Captain.

**LADY CAPTAIN'S DAY** ("FIXED COMPETITION") - Format to be the choice of the Lady Captain. (Committee August 2013).

In order to win a prize on Lady Captain's Day a lady must have completed three "qualifying cards" within the 12 months preceding the competition. If unable to play in strict handicap order or cannot stay for the prize presentation, players will be ineligible for Lady Captain's Day prizes. (Committee August 2015).

# **PAST CAPTAINS' COMPETITION -**

- 1) The Annual Past Captains' competition will be open to Past Captains of South Cliff (who are playing members or social members) and Past Captains of any club who are full paying members of South Cliff.
- 2) The immediate Past Captain organises the day and will be known as the "Captain of the day".
- 3) The Past Captains' competition is a non-qualifying event. The format to be decided on the day by those playing with the final decision being made by the immediate past captain, who also provides nominal prizes. (Committee July 2015)
- 4) Entry fee applicable for this competition.

LADY CAPTAIN v. LADY SECRETARY – Singles Match Play. Teams drawn. Handicap Index limit 37.2. Trophy awarded to winning team. Number of holes played to be decided by Lady Captain and Lady Secretary. (No change of clothes necessary for prize giving. (Committee Sept.2008). Full difference in handicap. (WHS)

#### **MIXED COMPETITIONS**

(Note: Ladies are reminded of Eligibility Rule No. 1 on page 3)

**SAVE THE CHILDREN** – Mixed Competition qualifying round over 18 holes. Winners must be available to go forward to District Finals and Finals.

**MIXED JUBILEE CUP** – This competition is now run by the Club.

**LADIES v. RABBITS** – Format decided by Lady Captain and Rabbit Master and winning team receives the Fowler Trophy.

**LADIES v. EGGS** – Format decided by Lady Captain and EGGS Captain and winning team receives the Jack Walker Bowl.

# **COMPETITION RULES**

#### **MARKERS**

- 1) If a member has to drop out of a competition after the draw has been made, she is required to find a replacement marker and is liable for the entry fee. Under no circumstances must a player be left without a playing partner. (Committee 1995). A penalty will be considered (Committee April 1998).
- 2) If a player has to withdraw from a Drawn Competition after the draw has been made, the Competition Secretary must be informed.
- 3) In the case of illness and bereavement the Committee may rearrange players in the draw. (Committee August 2015).

**LIABILITY OF ENTRY FEES** – All entry fees for competitions must be paid before play. Members who are unable to play in a competition after the draw has been made are responsible for their entry fee.

# LADIES' DAYS – STARTING TIMES

- 1) All ladies are requested to play within the time band, if possible, and to use times close together and not leave gaps on the time sheet.
- On Prize days all ladies must play in the time band.

  Time reservation on Tuesday 10.00 to 10.56 a.m.

  Time reservation on Fridays 9.28 to 10.24 a.m.

  Time reservation on Winter Competitions is 10.00 to 10.56 a.m.
- 3) Ladies playing outside the time band should note the following: Ladies are requested not to tee off in the 15 minutes before the start of the Ladies time band, and book a tee time on the Booking Reservation System (BRS).
- 4) Ladies wishing to play in the time band but not in the competition are requested to take a time at the end of the time band.
- 5) Ladies are requested to adhere to the times they have booked if, for any reason, they are not on the tee ready to tee off at the stated time, they are required to take the next vacant time on the sheet, or revert to the end of the list. In a drawn competition, failure to adhere to starting time means instant disqualification: except in exceptional circumstances the committee has the right to override this ruling. Please remember to keep to your booked time to prevent "hold ups" and to assist everyone to have an enjoyable round.
  - 6) Time Sheet for drawn competitions Time allocated for all drawn competitions will cover sufficient time slots for entries. (Committee Oct 2003). Ladies playing outside the time must book a tee time on the BRS.
  - 7) For ALL medals and ALL Club Competitions, ladies must sign competition entry book and return all cards.

**COUNTRY MEMBERS** – Country members may enter South Cliff competitions but are not eligible to win any Cups, Trophies or the Lady Captain's Prize.

**DRAWS** – All suitable competitions to be drawn in threes (A.G.M. 1993). Two divisions : 0 - 23.4 and 23.5 - 37.2 except where otherwise indicated. Prize days – the draw shall be made in one division.

Please note (A.G.M.1997) there will be two draws, one for players in the normal time band, where players are drawn within handicap bands when competition rules require this, and a second draw for players playing outside the time band. The ladies playing outside the time band will be drawn in one group.

**MATCHES** – The first-named player in each match must contact her opponent and offer three dates over the whole of the time period allowed, one of which should be at the weekend. If the first-named players tries to fix a date and fails, due to her opponent not agreeing to the dates offered, she should inform the Competition Secretary who will adjudicate with, if necessary, the help of the Committee (Committee May 1979).

Walkovers: If walkovers are entered on the match sheet or given verbally, they cannot be rescinded. A walkover in the Final may only be given through illness. All finals must have a Referee appointed by the Competition Secretary (Committee Aug.2006).

# PRIZE MONEY – To be reviewed annually.

Medals and Stablefords carry a prize of £5 voucher for the winners of each of the divisions (0-19.7, 19.8-26.1 and 26.2-54). All ties in Medal and Stablefords will be decided on the back 9.6.3.1 countback.

**COURSE ETIQUETTE** – Players should be on the tee and ready to play five minutes before their allocated time. Players with one free hole in front must let the players following pass through.

**LOST BALL** – **THREE** minutes only is allowed for search, but the players following should be allowed to pass through whilst the search is proceeding. Do not wait until the three minutes is up to then call them through.

# **BAD WEATHER DURING A COMPETITION -**

1. In any Competition the Lady Captain or her representative will act on behalf of the Committee in respect of these rules.

- 2. If the course is open, all Ladies' competitions will be played, the only exception being in the event of danger from lightning, or vision being severely restricted because of fog, players may leave the course or, alternatively, shelter after marking the position of their ball, continuing to play at the earliest opportunity. If a player leaves the course she will report to the Lady Captain or her representative as soon as is practical. If the reason is considered to be satisfactory the Player incurs no penalty, other wise the player shall be disqualified (Rule 6-8) (Ladies Committee Aug 2005).
- 3. If the Committee decide to suspend play a HORN will sound, Play will cease immediately and not resume until the HORN has sounded again. Players should mark their ball, lift it and take shelter.
- 4. R&A Rule 5.7 (January 2019) will apply.
- 5. If conditions are unsafe for any competition to be played, the Committee will re-arrange the competition on the next most convenient date (Committee Aug.2015).

# MARKING A CARD – A handicap score card must bear :-

- 1 The names of the player
- 2 The date on which the score was marked
- 3 The signature of the eligible Marker
- 4 The signature of the player
- 5 The handicap index and Course handicap of the Player
- 6 It is advisable to check the card hole by hole before signing the card.

Scorecards must be posted in the Score box promptly after play.

**SAFETY** – In the interest of safety, ladies are requested to leave their holdalls and golf equipment in the locker rooms until they leave the clubhouse. At no time should equipment etc be left in a dangerous place in the hall. This is to conform to Health and Safety regulations.

**PRACTICE ON THE COURSE** – When a competition takes places on an alternate day, the committee will permit play on the competition course on any day between the alternate day and the main competition.
