Michael Rhodes and Alan Morris came third on 41 points. There were 9 Twos overall, including a pair each from Steve and Jason Taylor.

Now that coaching is allowed to commence again outdoors, Pannal Professionals Dave and Martin Padgett have been busy with individual lessons.
