



'Summer Ringer'

Aboyne Senior Summer Ringer Competition Rules 2021

1. The Summer Ringer competition starts from Tuesday 4th May and concludes on Tuesday 19th October. There will be a 'one off' entry fee of £5 per person.
2. The Ringer will run alongside existing Tuesday Senior 18 hole club competitions.
3. There will be three handicap prizes.
4. Handicaps will be based on WHS Handicap Index as at 4th May '21 and will remain unchanged over the entire competition. (Max competition Handicap is 24)
5. At the start of the competition each hole will be counted as a 10 so every player starts with a gross score of 180. As each hole is rung these 10s are replaced with the ringer score taken. At the end of the season the handicap is deducted from the total gross score to provide a nett score as per any medal type competition. The winner of the Summer Ringer will be the lowest nett score. An updated league table will be sent out weekly via email and also posted on the Seniors Notice Board.
6. Ringers can only be taken during an official Senior competition, where play is from the yellow tees. Ringers cannot be taken during a Scramble competition for obvious reasons. In total there are 19 opportunities to take a Ringer over the '21 Summer season assuming no further lockdowns or other unforeseen events which impact on normal play.
7. Any ringer(s) must be indicated by circling the selected '**GROSS**' score on that day's scorecard. In a team competition where a single card is used, i.e a 123 Stableford or Triple6 Stableford please take care to indicate clearly any ringers that are taken and by whom.
8. During applicable Tuesday rounds any number of ringers can be taken but each hole can only be rung once over the entire season. For example, if you ring a 3 at the first and then get a 2 the following week that is considered as 'unlucky'.
9. Scores should be rung on the day of competition and indicated clearly as per note 7. The scorecard should then be placed in the 'Seniors Card Box' post round.
10. It is **NOT** mandatory to take a ringer every week.
11. In the event of any unforeseen circumstance during the duration of this competition the Seniors Committee will make any amendments or changes considered necessary to the benefit of the majority of the entrants.

12. Scores on temporary greens cannot be submitted unless a green is 'out of commission' for a significant period, in which case a decision will be taken by the Senior Committee.
13. Latest R & A Golf rules apply.
14. In the event of a tie, usual medal count-back rules will apply.
