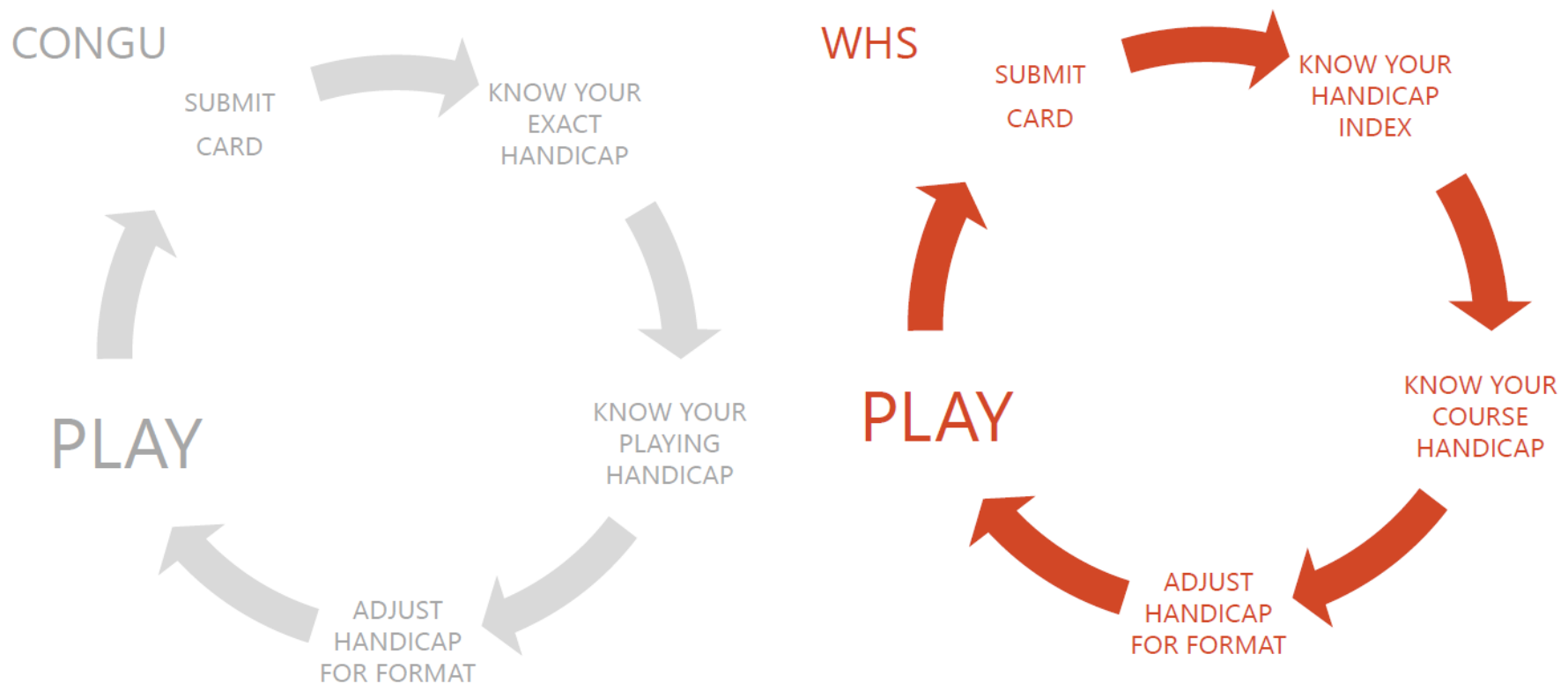


WORLD HANDICAP SYSTEM

from 2 November 2020

Quick Guide for Players



HOW DO I KNOW MY HANDICAP INDEX?

- You will be notified of it before November
- It is not just your exact handicap as it stands at the moment
- Available every day via App, website, or clubhouse/ Pro Shop terminal
- The Handicap Index is the number you take to any golf course in the world



HOW DO I CONVERT HANDICAP INDEX TO COURSE HANDICAP?

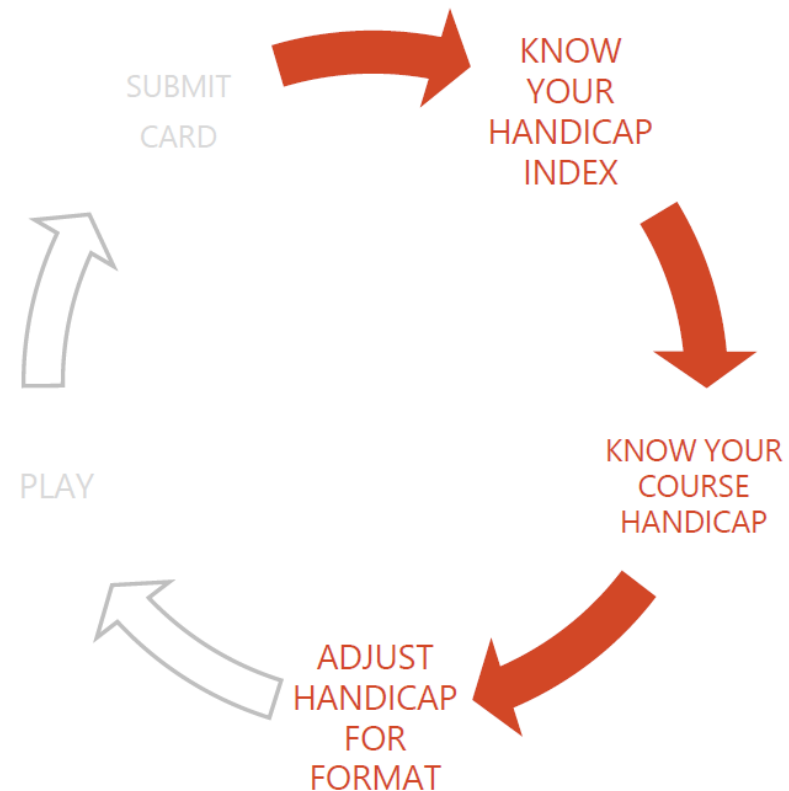
- Use the lookup table outside the Pro Shop
- This gives you a handicap for any tees you play from
- At CRGC, there are lookup tables for:
 - Mens
 - White, Yellow, Blue
 - Ladies
 - Red, Blue



Your handicap record will reflect how well you play against your **COURSE HANDICAP**

HOW DO I CONVERT A COURSE HANDICAP TO A PLAYING HANDICAP?

- This is the adjustment for the competition format (see next page)
- Different competition types have differing stroke allowances
- Similar process as currently (eg. for 4BBB m/play) – but the allowances can be different, and the 4BBB calculation sequence is important (see example following)



Your competition result will reflect how well you play against your **PLAYING HANDICAP**

Strokes Received: Playing Handicap

REMINDER: Playing Handicap is used only for competition scoring; your Course Handicap is used to record your strokeplay scores for handicap purposes

<u>Singles Formats</u>	<u>Handicap Allowance</u>	<u>Team Formats</u>	<u>Handicap Allowance</u>
Individual match play	100%	Four-ball match play	90%
Individual stroke play	95%	Four-ball stroke play / stableford	85%
Individual stableford	95%	Foursomes	50% of combined team handicap
Individual par / bogey	95%	Greensomes	60% Low handicap + 40% high handicap
Individual Maximum Score	95%	Scramble (4 players)	25%/20%/15%/10% from lowest to highest handicap

Course Hcp → Playing Hcp Crib Sheet

Singles Strokeplay (95%)

Course Handicap	Playing Handicap
0 to 10	Same
11 to 30	1 less
31 to 50	2 less
51 and over	3 less

4BBB Matchplay (90%)

Course Handicap	Playing Handicap
0 to 5	Same
6 to 15	1 less
16 to 25	2 less
26 to 35	3 less
36 to 45	4 less
Etc.	

New 4BBB Matchplay Stroke Allowance Rule

Every player uses 90% allowance to create Playing Handicap from Course Handicap

THEN Use differences in Playing Handicaps

- **BEWARE:** Do NOT compare Course Handicaps (& then 90% of the delta)
 - This often produces the **WRONG** result

4BBB MatchPlay Example

- Laura (28.5) and Georgia (6.3) team up to play Nick (6.3) and Ken (23.0) in 4BBB matchplay. All are playing off Blue tees.
