### **SHARE THE LOVE**

A huge response to the Senior's Interclub Match survey—80 respondents provided wide ranging views which your committee will review. With match participation in 2019 confined to just 35 of our 150 members, we were keen to understand member's attitudes to these fixtures and see if there are any actions we can take to widen their appeal.

From the survey results, two immediate actions became apparent. Firstly, the need to provide better information as to what is involved, particularly for newer members. Secondly, for home matches at least, we will look at ways of fixing the meal times to assist in minimising the post-match wait. I did note concerns that people were not balancing their bids for home versus away matches. I can advise that examination of the 2019 participation reveals no members posting a significant imbalance of away versus home matches. Derek will remain vigilant in 2020 however. It is disappointing for some that the maximum handicap of 28 excludes them from matches, but this limit is imposed upon us by all participating clubs who frequently remind us of this rule. A summary of the survey results is attached. All the comments will be viewed and discussed. Let's broaden the base and share the love for these very social, very friendly matches.

#### **Ron's Remarkable Rule Revelation of the month**

Each month, Ron Cowper a qualified EGU club rules official, offers a clarification or explanation of a particular rule of golf.

#### This month: ORIGINAL BALL FOUND AFTER PLAYING PROVISIONAL PAST SPOT WHERE ORIGINAL BALL WAS ESTIMATED TO BE

Q. A player strikes a ball on the 14th into the trees. Believing that the ball might be lost, the player plays a provisional ball. Unable to find the original ball, the player plays the provisional from a spot nearer the hole than where the original ball was estimated to be. The player goes forward and finds the original ball. Which ball is in play?

A. The provisional ball is now in play as it was played from a spot nearer the hole than where the original ball was estimated to be. The original ball must be abandoned.
