For those who have missed it, the good news is that competitive golf returns to Pannal from 4<sup>th</sup> July, following a lot of hard work behind the scenes to ensure it can be done safely. New procedures now apply to scorecard handling and recording as well as the on-course protocols which have been operating successfully for several weeks. Given that nearly three months of the normal qualifying season has been lost, the golf committee has had to cancel some Trophy Competitions and reschedule others in a revised format, but there is still much to look forward to over the coming months. Unsurprisingly, there is a full field for the Barber-Bratby Trophy on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> July, a medal competition with the best four scorers progressing to matchplay knockout to determine the winner. There is an Open Medal on Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> and Stableford on Tuesday 7<sup>th</sup>. Another piece of good news is that, following the Prime Minister's announcement last week, the Clubhouse will reopen on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> July, with a limited food & beverage service and some restrictions in place to enable safe operation for staff and members alike.
