

Competitions Entry Procedure (Men and Vets)

- Each player MUST sign into the competition via one or other of the PSI screens in the foyer, or Pro Shop or via the HowDidIDo app, BEFORE commencing their round.
 - If starting your round before the Pro Shop is open the screen in the foyer or the HowDidIDo app should be used
- The competition entry fee will be deducted from your competitions account at this point.
 - Please ensure your competitions account remains in credit. Failure to do so will prevent entry into competitions. (Your account balance can be checked via the PSI screens or the ClubV1 Members Hub)
- On completion of your round you MUST enter your score on one of the PSI Screens or via the HowDidIDo app.
- Ensure your scorecard is completed correctly with your name, date, tees used, course handicap, Marker's (Verifier) name and signature* as well as your scores clearly legible.
- The completed scorecard MUST be placed in the competitions box located in the foyer just outside the men's changing rooms on the same day of the competition. Failure to do so will result in disqualification but your score will still count towards your handicap.

Please note that players who consistently or deliberately fail to record their scores or return score cards risk being barred from further competitions for a specified period if the organising committee feel that such an action is deemed appropriate.

In the unlikely event of the PSI terminals failing to work properly – sign-in to the competition should be via the Pro Shop and completed score cards posted in the competitions box.

When playing in a club Cup, Trophy or Honours Board competition, a player's scorecard MUST be marked (verified) by a player taking part in the same competition. This condition does not apply to all other competitions - such as monthly medals/stablefords, midweek stablefords and Vets midweek stablefords and medals – but should still be marked (verified) by a person with a valid, club issued handicap index, even if they are not participating in the same competition.
