

Most Counties run a County Card Scheme for their affiliated members and from 2012 all golf club members affiliated to the Shropshire & Herefordshire Union of Golf Clubs have been entitled to receive a County Card as part of their annual Affiliation fee.

There is a fantastic number of Golf Clubs taking part in the scheme both in Shropshire & Herefordshire and Nationally, with currently over 1,400 courses available to play using your Card.

GETTING BACK TO GOLF

Spring 2021 course update

As we will soon be back playing again it has been pleasing to see Ian George and his small team of green staff have continued to work throughout the 2021 lockdown. Significant work has been carried out notably along the water margins of the Pollard Oak hole. The resultant views of the lake are very aesthetically appealing indeed.



On the Championship much of the

lower branches of the trees between fairways have been trimmed and the rough cut back to present the course in a tidier condition.

On both courses:-

- 1. ALL Fairways have been aerated, some twice
- 2. ALL Tees have been aerated
- 3. Greens have been cored and top dressing applied and brushed in
- 4. Lawn sand has been applied greens as a turf hardener and to aid moss control
- 5. A calcium supplement has been applied to greens and aprons
- 6. A fertiliser & root stimulant has been applied to tees, aprons, approaches & surrounds
- 7. Slow release fertiliser will be applied to the greens prior to the commencement of play on 29th March.

Waste bins will be back in situ – thank you to some members who have gone around the course and picked up litter left from when bins had to be removed.

Please be aware as we start back the height of the cut on the greens will remain slightly high and the greens will be of a slower pace. The height of the cut will be gradually reduced as conditions allow. Please can we continue to be mindful of our buggy and trolley traffic around green aprons and surrounds. It is very noticeable the difference it makes.

Winter League - Update

Thank you to those who entered the winter league – obviously as a result of the Covid lockdown play in the event was drastically curtailed. As a result, we will resume the leagues in the Autumn of 2021 with those who entered previously being given a free entry into this years event.

Friendly Matches

- Direct input of all scores from general play rounds
