## THE SOCIAL RABBITS A BRIEF HISTORY

About twelve years ago a number of Rabbits members whose handicaps fell below sixteen opted to play together generally ahead of the Rabbits on a Saturday morning but to remain in the Rabbits Section and support and enjoy the social side of life in the Rabbits.

Players' (including Ray Black, John Harbon and Alan Hessell) handicaps fell below 16, making them ineligible to play in Rabbits competitions. Initially, some players opted to join the Niblicks group, however, some were reluctant and decided to form a new group – the Social Rabbits. This group continued to play with the Rabbits on Saturday mornings, except when there was a Buck Rabbit competition, when the Social Rabbits would tee off after the Niblicks and ahead of the Rabbits competition.

Steve Duro joined the group in 2009 and having established himself within the group for two years, he suggested a more formalised approach to the group's Saturday morning rounds in 2011. Two annual competitions were introduced – The Golfer of the Year and the Eclectic – whereby scores recorded across the entire year would count towards both competitions and Steve provided trophies for both.

In 2014, when a number of Social Rabbits members' handicaps had increased to more than 16, the group's rules were formalised to permit these players to remain with the group if they so desired.

The size of the group steadily increased from 12 in 2011 to the current day maximum level of 20.
