

Ron's Remarkable Rule Revelation of the month

Each month, Ron Cowper a qualified EGU club rules official, offers a clarification or explanation of a particular rule of golf.

This month: BALL EMBEDDED IN ITS OWN PITCH MARK

Q. A player's ball is embedded in its own pitch mark in the soft ground on the 12th hole. Is the player permitted to lift and clean the ball, and if so, where must it be dropped?

A. The ball may be lifted and cleaned. The reference point is the spot right behind where the ball is embedded. The relief area is one club length from this point, no nearer the hole and within the general area.
