WITH the 2022 season now coming to a conclusion it is time to reflect on what has been another fantastic year for Cardross Golf Club

The common themes the absolutely are magnificent condition of our golf course and the warm and friendly welcome that everyone receives when they visit us.

We are rightfully very proud of both and are always grateful for the support and messages received.

Our membership numbers continue to grow and even in these challenging times we are delighted to also see continued growth in clubhouse usage that allows us to expand our plans going forward on the social front.

AS highlighted in our previous newsletters, we have now completed work on our new brand signage and general aesthetic improvements focussing particularly on our clubhouse main with additional entrance and surrounds improvements planned in the future.

Our new club logo is now prominent in a number of areas around the club and gives us a genuine brand identity as we continue to move the club forward.







ON THE COURSE...



WE can all agree that the condition of our fantastic course has been one of the absolute highlights of this season - a testament to the hard work of Course Manager Darryl Munro and his team and a return on the significant investment on new machinery and on-course equipment.

From members to visitors, tournament competitors and society guests, the feedback from all has been nothing but positive.

Darryl tells us... "With the end of the season we will now commence with the essential greens maintenance work which will include verti-drain at 9-10inch depth, pencil tine at 3-4inch depth followed by a top dressing of roughly 30 tonnes of sand. The scarifying work will now take place at a later date due to the delivery of our new pedestrian scarifier being delayed. Once this is done we will be applying another 15 tonnes of sand.

When the greens have healed up the AIR2G2 will be used on them to give us our final deep aeration for the year. Through doing aeration work this way we have seen the organic matter drop slightly more than previous years when hollow coring was carried out. The plan is to continue this way until/if the STRI soil analysis shows it's no longer as effective.

We will now be setting the course up for winter play with winter tee mats in use where needed and ropes out around the course to help protect certain areas."









ON THE COURSE...









ON average, approximately 50% of the land a course sits on is used for golf. That means there's often an opportunity to do more with the areas that aren't in-play and creating wildflower patches or meadows can be an easy and valuable action to take.

In the UK, only around 2% of the meadows that existed in the 1930's remain today. As custodians of large living landscapes, golf has space to make a difference, creating better environments for golfers and wildlife alike. By planting wildflower meadows, golf courses can also save time and money through less maintenance and fewer inputs such as water. More and more golf courses around the world are leaning into this win-win situation.

Here at Cardross, we are planning to undertake a combination planting programme of wild meadow flower and additional trees in some designated areas of the golf course and would very much appreciate any donations to assist with this venture.
