

Dress Code

Nevill Golf Club is a private members' club and has a dress code that should be respectfully observed by all members and visitors. This in many ways is common sense however please ensure that the dress code is followed to avoid any embarrassment.

The basic principles of our dress code are that traditional golfing attire is worn on the Course and that the minimum standard of dress required for the Clubhouse is what would be referred to as "smart-casual". It is the responsibility of all members to comply with the dress code and to ensure that other members, guests and visitors do so as well.

Members are requested not to change clothing in the car park but instead to use the excellent changing facilities provided in the Clubhouse. Changing of shoes in the car park is acceptable.

Finally, please note that the Professional's shop and the Clubhouse staff-members are instructed not to admit or serve members and visitors who do not observe the dress code. The General Manager's or a Board Members' judgement on the day will be final.

On the Course, practice areas and putting greens...

- All golfers should wear appropriate golf attire (the most appropriate is that which has been designed for golf) - jeans, shirts hanging outside trousers, shorts above $\frac{3}{4}$ mid-thigh, cargo shorts, beach-wear or other sports wear are not acceptable. Ladies may wear 'crop' type golf trousers.
- Hats and visors are permitted but are not to be worn backwards.
- Golf shoes with soft spikes or pimpled/moulded soles ~~must~~ should be worn; other types of footwear are not permitted.
- Socks should always be worn. When worn with shorts these should be either ankle length white socks, white trainer socks or the 2019 Knox Cup socks.

Off the Course, in the Clubhouse and surrounding areas...

- Acceptable:
 - Normal golf attire
 - Clean casual wear - such as open neck shirts, sweaters and cardigans.
 - Smart jeans without rips
 - Footwear (including trainers) worn with socks, including ankle-length socks. Deck shoes without socks.
- Not acceptable:
 - Wet or soiled clothing must not be worn or brought into the Clubhouse beyond the entrance and locker rooms.
 - Shorts above $\frac{3}{4}$ mid-thigh
 - Sleeveless shirts, beach-wear or other sports wear.

- Golf shoes, other than on the terrace, in the Locker Room and Pro Shop areas and except in dry weather conditions (and members will be advised when this is the case).
- 'flip flops'
- Hats (indoors)
- Ladies' exceptions:
 - Shoulder-less tops/dresses, where otherwise in keeping with the intent of the dress code.
 - Open-toed foot wear if appropriate to their style of dress
 - Dress hats when appropriate.
- Other exceptions:
 - At certain times alternative dress levels may be adopted (functions, AGM, Awards, etc) and members will be advised when this is the case.
