#### **COURSE IMPROVEMENTS:**

Here at Hawkstone, we are indebted to the team of greenkeepers; under the watchful eye of lan George, this small team are always kept busy on the course. They are absolutely core to the club and we celebrate and thank them for their work in providing us with a splendid golf course in superb condition all year round. Ian George has been employed at Hawkstone for around 22 years — his skill and knowledge of the course is second to none. Ian said to me recently, "there are times when a greenkeeper's job is unenviable, but that is probably true of most jobs. Most of the time greenkeeping is a very enjoyable and challenging job in a pleasant environment.

One of the best things about the work is that it is very varied both seasonally and throughout the average day or week. For this reason it's difficult to describe a typical day but some tasks such as bunker raking and changing the position of the hole are carried out regularly throughout the year. Reconstruction and development work is usually concentrated in the winter months with mowing dominating the timetable during summer."



As members, there are always some basic rules of golf etiquette that help everything run along smoothly. We know there will be the odd player who may be thoughtless or careless – please don't let it be you.

Please make sure that you ALWAYS repair pitchmarks - this includes any you see which may not be your own.

As well as looking unsightly, from a golfing point of view, pitchmarks can affect ball roll and cause a player's putt to bobble and deviate offline. Studies have shown that on average, a golfer will make 8 pitchmarks during a round of golf. If 130 rounds are played per day, that's over 1,000 pitchmarks per week; no surprise then that it can be difficult to hole a putt!

It's essential that all players are diligent in their repair of pitchmarks on greens. A correctly repaired pitchmark will recover in 24 hours. An unrepaired pitchmark left unattended for two hours will take up to two months to recover.

Members are requested not to take their trolley:

Onto the greens and tees

Between a greenside bunker and the green

Onto the fringes and aprons of the green

Hawkstone Park Ltd are also focusing on buggy use through the winter when there are adverse ground conditions; they are asking that both members and visitors drive your buggy from the tee shot in the semi rough until you reach your ball and then drive 90 degrees to your ball where applicable. All buggies should also not be driven on the tees, green aprons and surrounding area. Buggies on the course during the winter months will be for visitors/members that are disabled and hold a blue badge.
