Golf Etiquette and Course Safety

West Cornwall Golf Club

Etiquette “The customary code of polite behaviour in society or among members of a particular group “

Etiquette in short is about “respect “

Respect the course – leave the course as you would expect to find it by repairing pitch-marks, replacing divots and raking bunkers.

Respect your fellow players – be sportsmanlike and polite

Respect for the game – by knowing the rules and etiquette of golf.

Spirit of the game

Golf is largely played without a referee and relies upon individual integrity. All players are required to conduct themselves in a disciplined manner and demonstrate courtesy to others and sportsmanship at all times.

Safety

Players should ensure that no one is standing close by or in a position to be hit by the club when making a stroke or practice swing. Ensure that players in front are out of range before playing.

Having played your stroke if there is any possibility of your ball hitting someone then a warning call **must** be made. The traditional call is “**fore**”.

Green Keepers

Show consideration to Greens staff on the course at all times and ensure that no stroke is made that might endanger them. **Green Keepers always have priority.**

The Ferry Path

Players must give right of way to walkers using the Ferry Path(which crosses the 4th and 9th holes) and should **always wait** until the path is clear before playing a shot.

The practice ground has a line of white stakes to the seaward side which delineates a public pathway. Walkers using the path have right of way and Golfers should not play shots whilst the pathway is being used. Similarly Golfers must give way to walkers and vehicles using the road to the Quay which crosses the 5th, 6th and 7th holes.

Holes 4 and 8

Holes 4 and 8 share a fairway and care is required to ensure player and public safety. Players should not play from the 4th Tee unless they are certain that the fairway is clear and there are no players playing approach shots into the 8th Green. **Pedestrians** on the Ferry Path **must be given right of way** at all times. When playing the 8th be aware of Players Teeing off the 4th and keep to the far right of the 8th fairway until you have sight of the 4th Tee.

Priority on the Course and Pace of Play

Priority on the course is normally dictated by a group's pace of play (the term **group includes a single** player). If your group has lost ground on the group in front then you **must** offer the group following you the courtesy of playing through. Always let the faster group through.

It is perfectly possible to complete a four ball round in three and a half hours. Slow play often results from failure to clear the green promptly or from being unprepared to play your shot immediately when it is your turn.

Care For The Course

All players are expected to consistently address the basic requirements in care for the course including;

Pitch marks

All pitch marks on Greens must be repaired by the player before moving to the next hole. (A pitch mark repaired within 10 minutes will recover within three days - A pitch mark left unrepaired for a day will take over a week to recover)

Divots made by players must be replaced

Bunkers

Players must rake Bunkers after playing from them and leave rakes appropriately positioned within the Bunker.

Trolleys and Golf Buggies

Please help to maintain your course by ensuring that all Buggies and Trolleys are kept to a minimum distance of **5 meters from the edge of any Green**.

Trolleys and Buggies must not be used on Tee areas.

Practice

Players are not permitted to practice on the course and in any event should never have more than a second ball in play.

Rubbish

There are bins placed around the course, please ensure that they are used for your rubbish.

Players following these basic rules of etiquette will make the game more enjoyable for all those involved.
